Luke 1:5-20

In the days of King Herod of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly order of Abijah. His wife was a descendant of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. Both of them were righteous before God, living blamelessly according to all the commandments and regulations of the Lord. But they had no children, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were getting on in years.

Once when he was serving as priest before God and his section was on duty, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to enter the sanctuary of the Lord and offer incense. Now at the time of the incense-offering, the whole assembly of the people was praying outside. Then there appeared to him an angel of the Lord, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, he was terrified; and fear overwhelmed him. But the angel said to him, 'Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard. Your wife Eliza-

beth will bear you a son, and you will name him John. You will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He must never drink wine or strong drink; even before his birth he will be filled with the Holy Spirit. He will turn many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. With the spirit and power of Elijah he will go before him, to turn the hearts of parents to their children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous, to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.' Zechariah said to the angel, 'How will I know that this is so? For I am an old man, and my wife is getting on in years.' The angel replied, 'I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news. But now, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time, you will become mute, unable to speak, until the day these things occur.'

Monday, November 28 — Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19

Psalm 80 is a lament and prayer for God's people in a time of crisis. It appeals to God's steadfast love and faithfulness, which is one of the Psalms' primary themes. It reminds us that we can (and should) call on God in times of need. It reminds us that we can affirm God's sovereignty and trust that God hears and answers our prayers — although we must learn to trust that God often answers our prayers in unexpected ways and at unexpected times.

- How do you maintain hope in difficult times? For what are you crying out to God today?
- Prayer: Faithful God, hear my prayers this week. Teach me, once again, that I can trust you, and that you will answer my prayers, even if you answer in unexpected ways. Amen.

Tuesday, November 29 — Jeremiah 33:14-18

Jeremiah recounts the promises of God's covenant with David, reminding Israel that God will act on Israel's behalf and that a King — in the line of David — would reign with justice and righteousness. This promise would be Israel's hope, but their confidence would be severely tested, as the ultimate fulfillment of Jeremiah's prophecy would not happen until the birth of Jesus some 600 years later.

- What helps you remain confident in God's promises over the passing of time?
- Prayer: Promise-Keeping God, help me see the longer view of your relationship with creation. Help me to continue trusting in your steadfast love and faithfulness. Amen.

Wednesday, November 30 — Luke 1:5-20

The birth of Jesus is one of the most significant events in human history. According to Luke, and the other Gospel writers, Jesus' birth was the fulfillment of the promises made by Israel's prophets. The angel Gabriel's words to Zechariah in Luke 1:13 are profound and have multiple levels of meaning. Not only has God heard the prayers of Zechariah and Elizabeth, but God has also heard Israel's prayers for salvation.

- Have you ever prayed for God's salvation? How has God answered your prayer? How might Jesus be the ultimate answer to the prayers you are praying today?
- Prayer: Merciful God, thank you for answering my prayers. Help me to remember that you act in unexpected and surprising ways. Grant me courage to trust you always. Amen.

Thursday, December 1 — Luke 1:21-25

Elizabeth's conception is one of many examples of a primary Gospel theme: promise and fulfillment. Elizabeth's pregnancy and the birth of John is the fulfillment of Gabriel's promise to Zechariah. The birth of Jesus is the fulfillment of Gabriel's promise to Mary (Luke 1:31) and the ultimate fulfillment of God's promise to Israel (Jeremiah 33:14-18).

- How have you experienced the fulfillment of God's promises in your life? How does Jesus fulfill God's promise to you?
- Prayer: Loving God, please forgive me for doubting your faithfulness. Open my eyes and ears, my heart and mind, to see the ways that you fulfill promises in my life. Amen.

Friday, December 2 — Acts 10:30-33

Angels are, by definition, God's messengers. They act and speak on God's behalf and are found throughout Scripture, from Genesis to Revelation. In Acts 10, an angelic messenger speaks to Cornelius with the same words that were spoken to Zechariah in Luke 1:13. The parallels are intentional: God's word to God's people is that God hears and answers prayer — and that God's salvation is the ultimate answer to every prayer.

How is God's gift of salvation an answer to your prayers?

 Prayer: Saving God, sometimes I forget that I need salvation. I trust in myself, and my own abilities. Save me from my arrogance. Save me by grace through faith in Jesus. Amen.

Saturday, December 3 — Genesis 18:9-15

Reading Luke's account of Zechariah and Elizabeth intentionally brings to mind the story of Abraham and Sarah. Like Sarah before him, Zechariah could not believe God's promise. Sarah laughed. Zechariah doubted.

- Have you ever had an experience like Sarah or Zechariah? Have you ever struggled to believe God's promises? Have you ever doubted God? The Good News is that God is faithful despite our doubts. The Good News is that God saves us from our lack of faith
- Prayer: God of Grace, I believe in you, in your Son, Jesus Christ, and in the Holy Spirit, but I still have doubts. Forgive my doubts and strengthen my faith, today and always. Amen.

In reflecting a bit on our 40 years as a part of the Trinity family, my thoughts about why we give have changed or perhaps grown.


I know we have an obligation to honor God as best as we can- and giving to church is a part of that. Chris and I have always given to church with a sense of gratitude for the many blessings God has bestowed upon us and our family. The blessings are clear and tangible to my way of thinking. We are grateful and know that God has been good to us.

And we have always felt an affirmative responsibility to support the financial needs of our church. Whether it was funds necessary for a capital campaign or funding of the annual church budget - this always seemed like a duty or responsibility that we share as participants in our local family of faith.

As I mentioned, I think I have evolved some in my thinking about why we give. I still think both those aforementioned reasons to give are important. But largely as a result of our service in Central America over the last 10 plus years, I know now what is most important to me. God has generously allowed those deeply personal experiences to shape our everyday thinking and our lives. We see God in the faces of the young women at The Leadership Center and in the faces of the children at Heart to Heart. We know that although meek and poor in material terms - they are richly filled with God's spirit which is so inspirational to us! Trinity and its members provide these ministries with funds and other support, and as a result we are enabling substantial personal education and development. We are providing meaningful opportunities to some of God's people who otherwise might not receive them. And in fact, Trinity's annual budget supports 10 different international Christian ministries and missions in Central America and Africa. The long-term impact of these ministries is known only to God, but all of us at Trinity are part of His Kingdom work.




Sponsor a Child
