Scripture Genesis 50:15-26 Taehwan Roh

Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, 'What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?' So they approached Joseph, saying, 'Your father gave this instruction before he died, "Say to Joseph: I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you." Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father.' Joseph wept when they spoke to him. Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, 'We are here as your slaves.' But Joseph said to them, 'Do not be afraid! Am I in the place of God? Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good, in order to preserve a numerous people, as he is doing today. So have no fear; I myself will provide for you and your little ones.' In this way he reassured them, speaking kindly to them.

So Joseph remained in Egypt, he and his father's household; and Joseph lived for one hundred and ten years. Joseph saw Ephraim's children of the third generation; the children of Machir son of Manasseh were also born on Joseph's knees.

Then Joseph said to his brothers, 'I am about to die; but God will surely come to you, and bring you up out of this land to the land that he swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob.' So Joseph made the Israelites swear, saying, 'When God comes to you, you shall carry up my bones from here.' And Joseph died, being one hundred and ten years old; he was embalmed and placed in a coffin in Egypt.'

Monday, August 21 — Genesis 45:1-28

Two affirmations by Joseph provide bookends for the final scenes in the story of Joseph. The first of these affirmations is in Genesis 45:7-8. (The second is in Genesis 50:19-20.) From the beginning of Joseph's story, we have seen God at work. Now, in Genesis 45, Joseph plainly states his confidence that what has transpired in his life is part of God's larger plan for his family—and for the world. The point is not that God wills human suffering, but that God can redeem human suffering and still accomplish God's purposes in the world.

- Have you ever experienced God's redemptive power when you (or someone you love) was suffering? What was that like for you?
 How did that experience impact your relationship with God?
- Prayer: Almighty God, sometimes my vision is narrow and selfcentered. Open my eyes to see more clearly the ways you are at work in my life and in the world. Amen.

Tuesday, August 22 — Genesis 46:1-7, 26-34

After revealing his identity to his brothers and reassuring them that God's providence had reunited them, Joseph told them to go and bring his entire family to Egypt so that they could be settled in the land of Goshen (which is in northern Egypt.) Reading this part of the story through the lens of the larger story of God's people, we are reminded that God's people are itinerant. Go back and read Genesis 12:1-4 — "The LORD said to Abram, 'Go' ... so Abram went."

- We believe that God is still a sending God (read the commissioning stories in the Gospels) which means that God will be sending us to the places we need to go. Are you willing to go where God sends you?
- Prayer: Merciful God, I confess that I am too often reluctant to listen to your voice and go where you send me. Grant me the courage I need to trust and obey. Amen.

Wednesday, August 23 — Genesis 47:1-26

The primary thread running through Genesis is God's covenant with Abram (later Abraham) and his descendants. (Remember that Jacob is Abraham's grandson.) The covenant spelled out in Genesis 12:1-3 promises that God will bless Abram and his family and that "in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." This has been a theme in Joseph's life in Egypt and is reinforced in Genesis 47:7-10. Since, as God's people and spiritual descendants of Abraham (see Galatians 3:6-7), we are still under the terms of the covenant. This means that, "in [us] all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

- How is your stewardship of God's blessings in your life contributing to God's blessing of the world (all the families of the earth)?
- Prayer: Covenant-Making God, teach me how to be a trustworthy steward of your blessings in my life. Use me to be a blessing to others. Bless the world through me. Amen.

Thursday, August 24 — Genesis 47:27-48:20

Before he dies, Jacob blesses Joseph's sons. It's a scene reminiscent of the scandal surrounding Jacob's own blessing by Isaac in Genesis 27. (Remember that Esau was older than Jacob, yet Jacob received the "primary" blessing from Isaac.) Jacob's blessing of Ephraim and Manasseh, and Jacob's explanation in Genesis 48:19, provides critically important context for the time in Israel's future when Ephraim is the stronger and more powerful tribe. Genesis is clear about the presence of God's guiding hand in the series of events that make up the story of Joseph's life. Reading the story, we discover that God often works in completely unexpected ways.

- Have you ever experienced this? Has God ever worked in unexpected ways in your life?
- Prayer: God of Wisdom, sometimes it is hard for me to understand the way you work in my life and in the world. Increase my understanding and my willingness to trust you. Amen.

Friday, August 25 — Genesis 48:21-49:33

After blessing Ephraim and Manasseh, Jacob blesses his other sons. The words of each blessing make the most sense in the larger context of Israel's (the nation) story, which is described in later Old Testament books. For today, consider the importance of blessing our next generations. The blessings passed on to the next generations can be material blessings, but they can also be so much more. Faith, wisdom, history, tradition, and encouragement are just few examples.

- Give some thought to what you are passing on to the next generations in your family and in your community. How are you blessing those that follow you? What are they receiving from you? What are they learning from you?
- Prayer: Eternal God, thank you for the multitude of blessings you have given to me. Show me how you want me to share them and bless the generations that follow me. Amen.

Saturday, August 26 — Genesis 50:1-26

The story of Joseph, which began in Genesis 37, ends with Jacob's death, Joseph's act of forgiveness, and Joseph's death. In the final words of Joseph (recorded in Genesis) he reinforces his earlier affirmation (Genesis 45:7-8) that despite the evil intended by his brothers, God intended it for good. The work of redemption and reconciliation was (and is) God's work. The thirteen (13) chapters of the story of Joseph is one of the Bible's most powerful examples of the wonderous things that God can do.

- The point is that if God can work in Joseph's life, God can work in your life. With that in mind, what wonders of God's love and grace have you experienced?
- Prayer: God of Wonders, I am overwhelmed by the gift of your amazing grace and the transforming power of your love. I offer you my praise and thanksgiving. Amen.


