Things I'd like to remember from today's message:	

Monday, October 24 — Leviticus 7:11-13

Leviticus, the third book in the Bible, addresses the communal life of God's people. Much about how God's people live and worship has changed since the book was written, but the overriding theme speaks across the millennia: God is in the midst of God's people and in response to God's abiding presence, we (God's people) are called to worship. One form of worship was called, the "sacrifice of wellbeing" (Leviticus 3:1) and it included what is commonly known as the thank offering. The practice is simple. When we are aware of God's presence and God's grace, we respond in worship (sacrifice.) We respond by offering thanks to God in real and tangible ways.

- Make a commitment to be aware of God's presence in your life this week. Take time before you retire in the evening to review your day. When and how did you experience God's presence?
 End your day with a prayer of thanksgiving to God.
- Prayer: Eternal God, I am thankful today for your abiding presence in my life. Thank you for your love and grace. Thank you for the gift of abundant and eternal life with you. Amen.

Tuesday, October 25 — 1 Chronicles 16:1-13

The first of the two Old Testament books of Chronicles opens with a long section of genealogy, followed by a chronicle of the reigns of King David and King Solomon. Chapter 16 describes David's response to the ark of the covenant being placed in the tent following his victory over the Philistines (1 Chronicles 14:8-17). It was a musical extravaganza that included David himself "leaping and dancing" (1 Chronicles 15:16-19). The Chronicler tells us that "David appointed the singing of praises" (1 Chronicles 16:7) and the result was a Psalm of Thanksgiving.

- The lesson is clear, when God is good, we respond with praise and thanksgiving. For what are you going to praise and thank God today? How will you express your thanksgiving?
- Prayer: God of Love, open my eyes, ears, heart, and mind to experience the wonders of your goodness. Teach me to worship you with praise and thanksgiving every day. Amen.

Wednesday, October 26 — Psalm 105:1-6

There are many parallels between David's Psalm of Thanksgiving in 1 Chronicles 16 and Psalm 105. The first six (6) verses of the Psalm call God's people to worship, to sing God's praises and to "give thanks to the LORD" (Psalm 105:1). Not unlike our worship today, where a call to worship is followed by an account of God's faithfulness (in music, scripture, and proclamation), Psalm 105 proceeds to describe God's faithfulness to Israel — the reasons for Israel's praise and worship.

- Think about your favorite hymns. Are any of them hymns of praise and thanksgiving? What do your favorite hymns teach you about God? Pay attention to the words of the hymns you sing. Let God speak to you through them.
- Prayer: God of Grace, I confess that I too often focus on problems and complaints. Forgive my lack of appreciation for your blessings. Help me hear your call to thanks-giving. Amen.

Thursday, October 27 — Psalm 107:1-9, 17-22

Many of the Psalms call God's people to praise and thanksgiving. Psalm 107 focuses on the ways God delivers us from a variety of troubles, including sin and sickness, and calls us to give thanks to God. Note how, in verse 22, the Psalm-writer references "thanksgiving sacrifices" (the thank offering.) The message for us is that when we experience God's mercy and healing, and respond with praise and thanksgiving, a tangible act of worship (sacrifice or offering) is appropriate.

- Give thought today to what inspires you to give tithes and offerings to God in worship. Is it an obligation or duty? Is it to meet a need (in the church or community)? Or is it because you have experienced God's love and grace (mercy and healing) and are thankful?
- Prayer: Merciful God, transform the way I think about tithes and offerings. Help me remember that they are a response to your blessings — acts of thanks-giving. Amen.

Friday, October 28 — Isaiah 12:1-6

Psalms of thanksgiving are found throughout the Bible. In Isaiah, the psalm of thanksgiving is a response to the promise that God will save Israel and establish a "peaceful kingdom." Look back at chapters 9 and 11. You will find familiar passages that we often read in the season of Advent. Each year, as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus, we remember that God makes and keeps promises. We believe that Jesus is the ultimate fulfillment of the promises we find in Isaiah. We are reminded of the good news that God is a promise-keeper. For that we are thankful

- The Bible is filled with examples of God making and keeping promises. Which of God's promises inspire you to thanks-giving right now?
- Prayer: Promise-Keeping God, thank you for Jesus, who was and is the ultimate fulfillment of your promise to save the world (and me!) I renew my commitment to follow him. Amen.

Saturday, October 29 — Jonah 2:1-10

The belly of a large fish is an extraordinary place to pray a prayer (or sing a song) of thanksgiving, but that's what we find in the second chapter of Jonah. Bible scholars find excerpts from several Psalms in Jonah's prayer, suggesting that he was in the habit of reading and praying them, so that the words of the Psalms were available to him — in heart and mind — when he needed them: "But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you; what I have vowed I will pay" (Jonah 2:9).

- What can you do in the days and weeks ahead to increase your ability to remember God's promises and cultivate a habit of thanks -giving?
- Prayer: Life-Saving God, you have protected and delivered me from trials and tribulations many times. Teach me how to remember your salvation and give thanks. Always. Amen.

That's what we're going to discover together as we consider how we might live *A Life of Thanks-Giving*.
