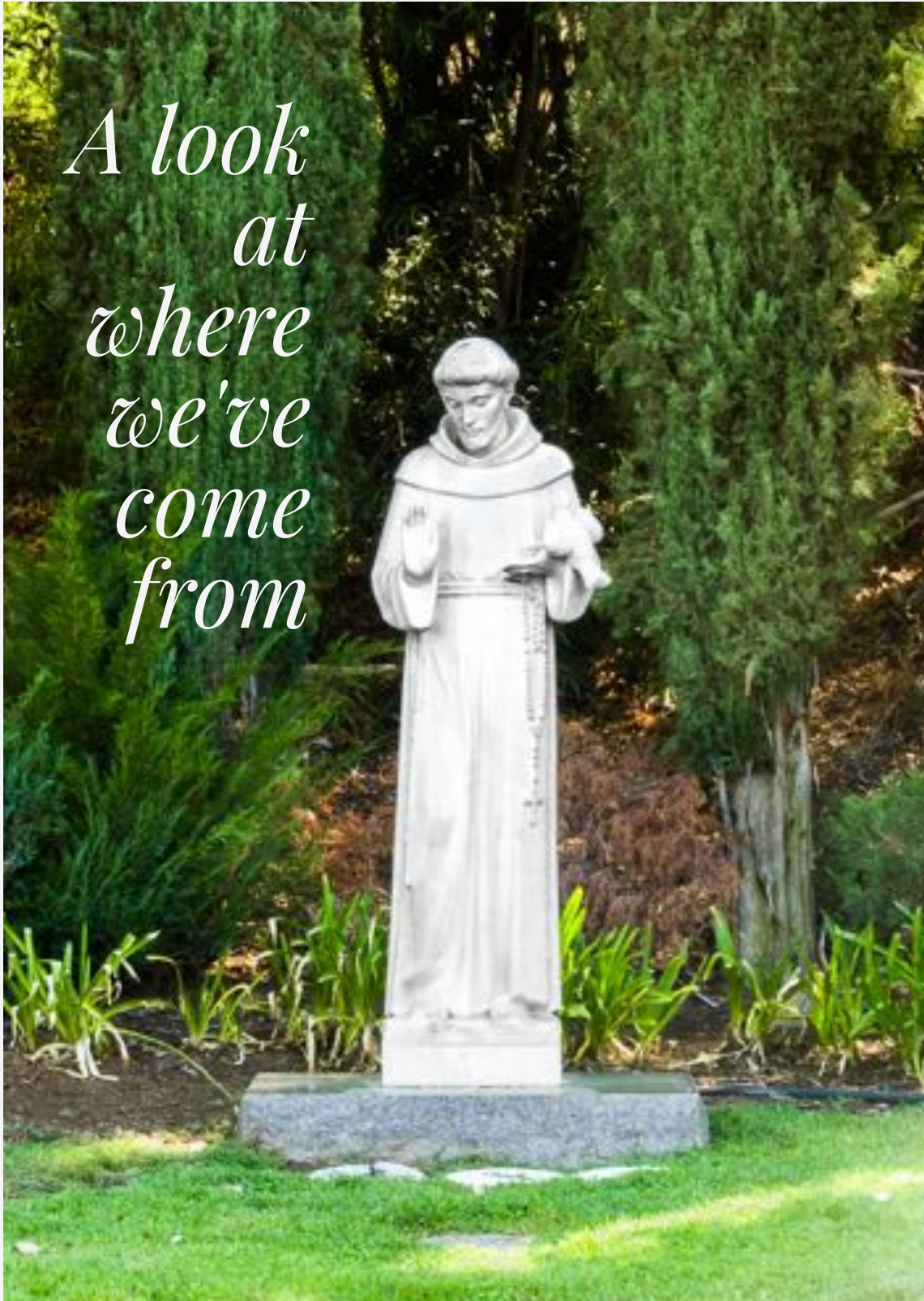

# 1959

The James Officer family started a preaching station in Pauma Valley that met in the Pauma Valley Community Center.

Al Barrett donated the land where St. Francis was built. His daughter Nancy Barrett was involved.

# 1975

On March 16th 1975, Bishop Wolterstorff consecrated the Church.

Early years highlights include hosting a live Nativity illuminated with luminarias lining the driveway. Nancy Brown and Martha Henkey, along with Sweeter Officer were instrumental in the Church.

# 1977

Joan and Author Welker made their arrival. Author was treasurer for many years.

Lee Stanley made with needle point, the beautiful kneeler. Joan Brown made the Easter frontal that is a beautiful work of art.

# 1982

The Parish Hall was built and paid for. There were artists teaching watercolors in St. Clare Hall and some of their art remains there today. Bill Bowman and Sally were artists leading the Art Festival which had a crowded Friday night dinner and reception.

# 1993

There was a Parish Newsletter. Patsy Fritz and Jo Ann Robinson helped publish the monthly news. Photo books were made. There was a parish picnic and softball games. We hosted a service with the Pala Mission. We Hosted the Adobe Tour. There was also a cooperative Good Friday liturgy with St. Stephens. With Children, there were also Christmas Pageants.

Outreach included providing for a Health Clinic. We raised the money to purchase an Ultrasound machine for the Clinic. A new organ was purchased when members supported fundraisers. The Dole family was a big contributor to the new organ.
