SUBURBAN SPIRITUALITY CLASS

FPC is sponsoring a special eight-week series of spirituality workshops that explore both the scriptural call for personal transformation and offer practices and frameworks for understanding our own growth. Central in this series is understanding our personality from a Christian perspective. All classes will have a mix of teaching, practice and break-out sessions. Facilitator, Rev. Evan Harrison, pastors Pittsboro Presbyterian Church and has certificates from multiple programs regarding work with spirituality and personality. This class is free, geared towards adults and is open to anyone, so feel free to tell or invite your friends.

Life is busy, yet we hunger for God 24/7. Reclaim an hour or so for yourself these next 8 weeks to experience God and a refreshingly authentic, empowered sense of self that Jesus envisioned for everyone who dared follow in his way.

This workshop is free and open to all of you (recommend to a friend if you like!) and is sponsored by First Presbyterian Church, Burlington. **Classes are 7-8pm Tuesdays in September and October on Zoom.**

Although topics may be adapted to the needs of participants, sessions will likely cover:

- **Practicing the Great Command:** *Reclaiming the Importance of Transformation in Christianity and the Practice that Helps this Transformation Occur*
- **The Danger of Acting and the Protection of Seed's Outer Shell**
Acknowledging some of Christ's chief concerns about religious people and embracing one of his most apt parables regarding the spiritual importance of our personality.
- **Suburban Contemplatives:** *Why we don't need to be monks to begin a life of introspection...and yet they were on to something.*
- **The Role of Personality in Spirituality:** *Three sessions covering 9 personality tendencies and how knowing about these structures can aid spiritual growth.*
- **Instinctual Drives:** *Appreciating and devoting healthy attention to the instincts hard-wired into us.*
- **New Space & Postures of Prayer** *Working out our salvation with Fear & Trembling, trying new physical postures of prayer and imagining what we need to continue in discipleship to Christ.*

We will also read poems by Langston Hughes, Paul Laurence Dunbar, and Gwendolyn Brooks, among others. Our text book will be *The*

Vintage Book of African American Poetry, ed. M. S. Harper and A. Walton (Vintage Books, 2000), available on Amazon in used paperback.
