



Get ready for Bash the Trash's *Sustainable Sounds*!

You will soon be seeing a performance from the musical group Bash the Trash called **Sustainable Sounds**. Bash the Trash uses musical instruments made from recycled and reused materials to explore concepts of sound, science, and sustainability.

Building instruments from trash highlights global issues such as plastic pollution and climate change, and this show helps students to understand how they can become a positive force for environmental change. Along the way we explore science concepts of sound, music, and how instruments work. Our goal is to build cool instruments from the cheapest possible materials, and make connections along the way.

The show brings three musicians playing a variety of strange instruments that demonstrates the science of sound; and explores where trash comes from. and where it goes! Shows are typically 45 minutes and are age-appropriate. *Kids with special needs welcome! Ear protection is recommended for those with hearing sensitivity.*
