Society of St. Vincent de Paul Mission Statement

**Who we are:**

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded in Paris in 1833 by a group of students to minister to those suffering from the effects of poverty and was named after St. Vincent de Paul, a 17<sup>th</sup> century French priest who devoted his life to serving the poor and the needy. The Society spread rapidly, arrived in the United States in 1845 and is now active in 153 countries and members are estimated at nearly 900,000.

There are 32 Conferences in the Dayton District and members (Vincentians) work directly with the needy by visiting them in their own homes, providing material assistance, affirming their dignity as children of God and offering prayer and hope.

**What we do:**

Primary areas of assistance are food, rent, utility payments, transportation, clothing and furniture. Members also work to help neighbors identify what keeps them in poverty and encourage them to make positive changes. And members advocate for the poor by striving to be their voice in unjust situations.

Conferences work with local food pantries, churches and agencies to offer numerous resources for additional help to our neighbors.

**Assistance:**

In 2018, the greater Dayton area Conferences served 23,304 neighbors with \$1,298,772.00 in assistance plus \$290,155.00 in donated goods and services. Vincentians made 3561 home visits and donated 57,176 hours and logged 10,457 volunteer miles. There are over 700 Vincentians in the Dayton District.
