If you have an incoming 4th Grader, the teams have created a **content specialist** for each teaching team. In other words, your child will have an opportunity to work with teaching teams of two instead of one teacher. The purpose is twofold:

- 1.) To gain content expertise for a rigid, viable implementation of curriculum
- 2.) Help them in transition to Middle School

If you have a 5th Grader, your child will have two teachers, but those teachers will not be teaming. The students have an opportunity to have a morning class with students, then in the afternoon, they will have another teacher with other students. The purpose is twofold:

- 1.) Increase the number of students in their classrooms so they will know more peers going to MS
- 2.) Help them transition to Middle School as 6th Grade is moving to student communities
