WHO YOU GONNA CALL?

Ken Bellau was a normal average citizen until Hurricane Katrina changed his life. The storm ripped through the state of Louisiana pummeling the city of New Orleans. When the levees collapsed, disaster struck with wide-spread flooding. Ken took hold of a fiberglass bass boat and trolled the waters looking for people in need. His efforts saved over 400 people. The state of Louisiana honored him and his boat by creating an exhibit memorializing the tragic events.

Ken's story is unique because he saved so many people. What's not unique are the efforts of ordinary citizens helping out neighbors. In fact, hundreds of people helped others during Katrina. It's a reminder that whenever a tragedy strikes a community, the first line of support rarely comes from civil authorities. It comes through neighbors. It comes through people on the ground with direct knowledge.

Ascension is no different. We are a caring faith community. We pray, we visit, we provide meals, we knit prayer shawls, we send grief books and sympathy cards. We also arrange for lay pastoral relationships through programs such as Stephen Ministry. We are there for one another whenever a need arises.

Several years ago, Church of the Ascension tapped four lay people to act as shepherds as part of the Ascension Cares pastoral care network. Each shepherd rotates responsibilities as they help the congregation attain the pastoral resources needed at any given moment. They are the first point of contact.

How does it work? If, for example, a member of the congregation suffers an illness, or has a specific need, contacting a shepherd is the most efficient method for communicating a pastoral care request. Shepherd 1 covers every member of the congregation with the last names from A-M. Shepherd 2 covers people with last names from N to Z. All four shepherds rotate responsibilities. You can email either shepherd 1 at shepherd1@knoxvilleascension.org, or shepherd 2 at shepherd2@knoxvilleascension.org depending on the last name. Once the email is sent, the clergy are notified, along with key staff members. The person will then receive a call from a shepherd.

As our congregation grows, and the pastoral needs increase, may we continue an upward trajectory of helping one another as needed. Shepherds are the first responders, the connectors, the communicators, and the organizers. They steer the boat and pull the resources together. So when a person needs to be added to the prayer list at the last minute, or when there is an unexpected death, or accident, who you gonna call? Call a shepherd.

On Thursday, November 8th, FOMA will present the Seraph Brass in concert at 7:30 pm. As is increasingly the case with both vocal and instrumental ensembles nowadays, the five women comprising this brass quintet are not resident at any one institution or together in one city. They instead convene several times a year to tour under the name Seraph Brass. Each performer is a university professor or symphony player in a different city around the country, and so the quality of the playing is assured. A programme for this concert had not been submitted by press time for this edition of the Parish Paper, but FOMA requested a mix of classics and more light-hearted fare. The performance is presented free of charge.

The first Sunday of Advent will be marked musically by two special events. First, at the 10:30 am service on December 2nd (the Sunday closest to St. Andrew's Day) we will celebrate the Kirkin' of the Tartan. Ascensionites with Scottish heritage are encouraged to bring your clan tartan to be blessed and recognized that morning. Bagpipers and a drum will be on hand to provide the iconic Scottish sounds we all enjoy.

And also on the 2nd at 5:30 pm, the Parish Choir and Boys and Girls' Choir will sing Lessons and Carols for the season of Advent. Six readings, each followed by an anthem or carol, will help usher in the four-week season of watchful waiting. A reception follows in the parish hall.

The Ascension Trekkers will take on two strenuous hikes in November in addition to the usual “easy Monday” outing. The first hike will be on Wednesday, November 7 in the Greenbrier area of the Smokies to Ramsey Cascades which is an 8 mile round trip. For seasoned strong hikers, this is considered moderate through beautiful old forest and involves some boulder climbing as one nears the Cascades. For others, it is a slow difficult climb after the first two miles although it still is beautiful and well worth the effort to experience one of the most beautiful falls in the park. The pace for this hike will be slow and will be an all day excursion. The next hike will be on Saturday, November 17 on Road Prong Trail, a shuttle hike from Clingmans Dome downhill to the Chimney’s trailhead for a moderate 3.3 miles (rocky and eroded in some areas) which offers two waterfalls/cascades. Another option for this trail is to go up/down from Chimney’s trailhead for about 2 miles only to see the Road Prong Cascade. Both of these hikes will start from the church at 9 am. The third outing will be on the Alcoa-Maryville Greenway on Monday afternoon at 1pm, November 19 for an easy 3-5 miles on a paved trail which is shared by cyclists and dog walkers. 
