“Life is Short, Live it Up?”

James 4:13-17

Today’s BIG IDEA:

The spiritually mature, recognize that all that they are and all that they have is a gift from God and use it for His glory.

Context:

Vs. 4:13-17 written to the wealthy merchant class within the scattered church.

- Those with financial flexibility to:
 - Relocate to pursue opportunity
 - Skills/Resources to pursue financial gain
 - Not living meal to meal
- Ours status
 - Avg American income 10x higher than Avg Income of rest of the world
 - Most Americans are comfortably in the top 10% of the world’s wealthiest citizens.

This passage applies to _____
