

John Paul Farmer is the Global Head of Public Sector at Stripe. He is also a Fellow of the University of Pennsylvania's Institute for Urban Research, President of Tomorrow City USA, and sits on the Board at Sand Technologies.

John Paul served as the 3rd Chief Technology Officer of New York City, where he built a more future-ready Big Apple through programs (e.g. NYC Digital Service, NYC Innovation Fellows, NYC Digital Reserve) and policy (e.g. the award-winning NYC Artificial Intelligence Strategy, the high-impact NYC Internet of Things Strategy, and the pioneering NYC Internet Master Plan). Alongside leaders from Spain and the Netherlands, John Paul co-chaired the Cities Coalition for Digital Rights and grew it to more than 60 member municipalities across the globe.

Previously, he was Director of Microsoft Cities, co-designing technology products and building cross-sector partnerships to make communities more livable, more vibrant, and more equitable.

In President Barack Obama's White House, John Paul served as the Senior Advisor for Innovation, helping to catalyze the govtech movement by co-founding and leading the Presidential Innovation Fellows program, and architecting what later became 18F and the US Digital Service network. He went on to advise France, Poland, Germany, Mexico, and others on how to replicate the success of these US programs.

John Paul has served as an adjunct professor at Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs, where he advised the US Mission to the United Nations on how the UN Security Council should address the risks associated with artificial intelligence.

He was selected as a term member of the Council on Foreign Relations. Early in his career, John Paul played professional baseball in the minor league systems of the Atlanta Braves and Los Angeles Dodgers.

John Paul holds an MBA with honors from the Graduate School of Business at Columbia University and an AB with honors from Harvard University.
