## Key Advocate Aurora Health Updates

- As the federal government redirects COVID-19 testing supplies to hotspots in other parts of the country, we must modify our testing approach to continue to best support our patients, communities and team members as supplies are limited. In line with CDC guidelines, our Safe Care promise and guidance from our Infectious Disease experts, we are modifying testing criteria for hospital admissions and observations as well as surgeries and procedures in keeping with state mandates. In addition, there may be changes to community testing in some areas, and we will update you accordingly. We continue to work diligently to secure more supplies and expand our testing capabilities.
- With COVID-19 top of mind, we know parents and caregivers have a lot of questions as the school year approaches. Last week, we held our third virtual community town hall on Facebook Live and heard from Advocate Aurora Health pediatric experts who answered questions related to back-to-school, immunizations, and more.
