CAL FIRE San Mateo-Santa Cruz Unit Allows Residential Burning With Valid Burn Permit

FELTON – Recent rains and cooler temperatures across the region have lowered the threat of wildfires allowing CAL FIRE's San Mateo-Santa Cruz Unit to cancel the suspension of residential backyard burning that became effective May 16, 2022. This transition will occur at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, December 1, 2022. Residents wishing to burn MUST obtain the necessary burn permit through their local Air Resources District and verify it is a permissive burn day prior to burning. Agriculture burns and hazard reduction burns within the State Responsibility Area must be inspected by CAL FIRE and a proper CAL FIRE burn permit must be obtained prior to burning.

CAL FIRE will continue to monitor weather conditions closely and will maintain the ability to suspend residential burning once again should weather and fuel moisture conditions become unfavorable.
