

FACULTY SPOTLIGHT

Dr. Schwartzbauer and fellow colleagues rallied together on March 15th to oppose the legislation that would repeal Maryland's all-rider motorcycle helmet law

"For the last several decades, deaths due to motor vehicle crashes have dramatically decreased with an uptick due to COVID-related driving conditions in the last two years," **Dr. Gary Schwartzbauer** says. "Over the same decades, motorcycle crash-related deaths have skyrocketed."



Dr. Schwartzbauer states this is thought to be due to older riders on ever increasingly powerful machines. The single, low, and cost-effective measure to prevent traumatic brain injury and death from a motorcycle crash is wearing a helmet. To support this, Maryland enacted an all-rider helmet law in 1992, and deaths per 10,000 riders dropped 56% over the following 5 years.

Un-helmeted riders are twice as likely to have a TBI and/or cervical spinal injury. Dr. Schwartzbauer, along with **Carla Aresco, CRNP**, joined a group from Shock Trauma, the School of Medicine, and colleagues from Trauma Net, the National Transportation Safety Board, Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, and the affected families to oppose the repeal of the law. The presented oral and written arguments were made on March 15th at the Maryland Senate Judiciary Proceedings Committee. "We are doing the right thing by keeping Marylander's safe!" 
