

most indoor settings, except on public transit, in health care facilities, and in congregate settings. Businesses retain the ability to require masks in their establishments. Employees who work in certain business sectors-including restaurants, retail, fitness, personal care, and entertainment—must continue to wear masks unless fully vaccinated. Those who are unvaccinated or not fully-vaccinated are strongly encouraged to wear masks in all settings. Masks will continue to be required in K-12 public schools, given low rates of vaccination among children. Virginia has administered nearly 7 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines. More than 4 million people have received at least one dose of the vaccine, representing over 63 percent of Virginia's

adult population. Governor Northam has said he remains confident the Commonwealth will meet President Biden's goal of having 70 percent of adults vaccinated with at least one dose by July 4th. During this pandemic, BPSOS supports the U.S Department of Health and Human Service's COVID-19 education campaign We Can Do This to increase education and awareness about vaccines. 




