DuPage County Vaccinations

DuPage County reopened a large-scale vaccination clinic on Wednesday, Oct. 14, to administer booster doses of Pfizer's COVID-19 vaccine. In DuPage County so far there have been 107,000 cases and 1,459 deaths from COVID-19. Since the beginning of Covid, the US has had nearly 740,000 deaths resulting from Covid. The average death per month in the US is 49,000, the highest worldwide. The vaccination center at the county fairgrounds in Wheaton will offer boosters by appointment only three days a week. Also, people seeking their first dose of the vaccine will be able to receive it at the fairgrounds. Those seeking booster shots should bring a COVID-19 vaccine card showing that they received a second dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine at least six months ago. Booster shots are available for the following eligible groups: anyone 65 and older; residents of long-term care facilities; adults who have underlying medical conditions; and adults who work or live in settings that put them at high risk of COVID-19 exposure or transmission. Healthcare workers, firefighters, police and teachers are in that category.

From Middle English word flepergebet, meaning "gossip" or "chatterer"

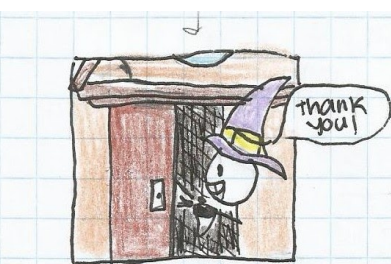
Jellygraph

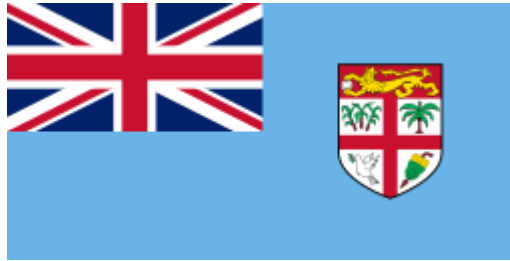
