Schmaltz Deli Relocates to Lisle By Meg Walls

Schmaltz's Jewish Deli has been a staple restaurant in Naperville for 16 years. Since then, the restaurant has not expanded much, until May 2020, when they opened a new location in Wheaton. However, it seems as if that location was only the first step in changes to the deli, as Schmaltz now plans to move their Naperville location to Lisle.

A few weeks ago, Schmaltz announced that they plan to relocate from their Naperville location to 3011, Ogden Avenue, which was formerly the home of Chinn's 34th Street Fishery. With this bigger location, Schmaltz hopes to expand both their quick and full service dining, allow for a separate retail area, and even add a drive-through for people who are really in a hurry. The village of Lisle has offered a tax incentive for Schmaltz to move to the new Lisle location.

Along with the expansion, Schmaltz's Deli also plans to expand their menu. The deli offers many sandwiches with corned beef and pastrami, sides such as a traditional Jewish matzo ball soup, and other treats like their black and white cookies. Schmaltz also intends to introduce vegetarian and vegan alternatives to their already expansive repertoire.

Pope Francis returned to Vatican City recently after a four-day trip to Iraq. This trip was very significant and will be remembered throughout history because Pope Francis was the first Pope to visit Iraq. While there, His Holiness met with Iraq's top religious leaders in Nefal to seek peace and strengthen bonds between the Roman Catholic Church and the Muslim world. Noteably, Pope Francis met with Grand Ayatollah Ali al-Sistani, an influential Shiite cleric, and discussed how spiritual leaders can help heal the wold. Pope Francis led mass at Baghdad's Saint Joseph Cathedral and told worshipers that he hoped the world would begin a "journey from conflict to unity."

With the increase in violence and COVID-19 cases in Iraq, Pope Francis' tour was thought over carefully. "I prayed a lot about this. And in the end, I took the decision freely," His Holiness said. "It came from inside. I said 'He who makes me decide this way will look after the people.'" Pope Francis met with large crowds during his trip and frequently wore a mask, in addition to having received a vaccination for COVID-19.

During his stay, the Pope visited the ancient city of Ur, the birthplace of Abraham and the city where Judaism, Christianity, and Islam are believed to have originated. Pope Francis stated that this shared bond should be a source of unity in a world that is often divided. Because of its cultural significance, Ur is protected as a World Heritage Site. Archaeological digs were previously prohibited because of conflict and security issues, but permission was granted after the fall of dictator Saddam Hussein.

As COVID-19 cases drop, some states are planning to remove mask mandates and further reopen their economies. Some health experts highly discourage this since a new COVID-19 variant has been discovered. Governors in Texas, Maryland, Mississippi, Connecticut, Arizona, West Virginia, and Wyoming have all announced plans to remove COVID-19 restrictions. Arkansas Governor Asa Hutchinson announced that if COVID-19 cases continue to decrease, COVID restrictions will be taken back, though he will reinstate restrictions if cases rise again. In Iowa, Governor Kim Reynolds lifted all COVID restrictions, including the mask mandate.

There are currently three different vaccines available to Americans: Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson. The Catholic Church has told people to only take the Johnson & Johnson options if they cannot get one of the other two because the vaccine was created using aborted fetal cells. In Phase 1A, healthcare workers were eligible to be vaccinated and now we have moved to Phase 1B, which includes people over 65, teachers, and other essential workers. President Biden has asked all states to make the vaccine available to all adults by May 1st.

Despite the fact that states are opening up, we still need to stay safe. To do this, we should continue to stay at least 3-6 feet away from other people, wear a mask inside of buildings, and sanitize our hands. Just remember to respect other people around you. 
