A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT STANDING RULES GOVERNING ELECTIONS WITHIN THE NEVADA REPUBLICAN PARTY; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

**BE IT RESOLVED, that the Nevada Republican Central Committee, does hereby
declare as follows:**

RESOLUTION PART A

A new Chapter 5 – Membership Rules of the Standing Rules of the Nevada Republican Central Committee is hereby added as follows:

STANDING RULES OF THE NEVADA REPUBLICAN CENTRAL COMMITTEE

CHAPTER FIVE – MEMBERSHIP RULES

1.0 Membership Roster Distribution

Subsection 1.1 – This section is intended to interpret and enforce Article 5, Section 2, ¶ C, Subparagraph 5 of the Bylaws of the Nevada Republican Central Committee.

Subsection 1.2 – Distribution of the membership roster is to include the information delineated below in Paragraphs (a) and (b), inclusive.

(a) First and last name.

(b) County of Residence.

RESOLUTION PART B

This resolution is hereby introduced by action of the Bylaws Committee which formally recommends its adoption by the plenary session of the Nevada Republican Central Committee.

RESOLUTION PART C

FORMAL STATEMENT BY THE BYLAWS COMMITTEE IN SUPPORT OF THE ADOPTION OF THE RESOLUTION:

- This resolution brings forward an amendment that implements a proposal to define precisely the distribution of membership roster information for the consideration and discussion of the Central Committee.
- The resolution protects email addresses for privacy but also the efficiency of communications; members will be more inclined to give non-functional or rarely checked email addresses if they know they would become public. The NRP Secretary has fewer than 10 NRCC members without valid email because the membership trusts that the data is protected.
- The committee recommends that party should avoid sharing telephone numbers and email addresses to avoid the risk of those numbers falling into the hands of commercial spammers.
- A properly controlled release of membership information will protect the party from potential liability issues.

RESOLUTION PART D

This amendment shall take effect and be in immediate force from and after its adoption at the meeting of the Nevada Republican Central Committee at which it was passed.
