I recently visited the new Rolls-Royce aviation museum in Indianapolis with our 2016 Teacher of the Year, Greg Ennis. Greg is a fantastic ambassador for AFA. We were treated royally and had a productive two days.

I was one of four speakers for the Museum ribbon cutting ceremony. The museum aims to get adolescents interested in science and technology and may encourage future careers in aerospace. Both want our Indiana AFA contacts to see how they can help AFA and expand the knowledge and publicity of the TOY program.

Chapter, State, and National Teacher of the Year (TOY) REMINDERS:

TOY SUBMISSION DEADLINE: Remember, National AFA can only **fund one (1)** K-12 TOY **per chapter this year.** If the chapter TOY program normally funds more than one, the chapter must fund those additional TOYs. Chapter and State TOY packages are due to National AFA **by April 30** to ensure checks and award components are sent to the chapter **to present to the teachers prior to the end of the school year.** National TOY nomination packages are due to National AFA by May 31.

REACH OUT AND SPOT A TEACHER! Each chapter is encouraged to reach out <u>now</u> and find a deserving teacher in the local area to recognize as the **2017 AFA Chapter TOY!** This recognition will go a long way to encourage and support <u>regular K-12 classroom teachers who desire to go "above and beyond" in their STEM instruction in any grade level; in any subject area.</u> If your chapter wants to recognize teachers from different levels (Elementary, Middle, High School) and you need funding, check out your Community Partners for help! From chapter recognition of these regular classroom teachers who are doing amazing things "beyond the bell," State TOYs are being identified and recognized by the AFA. The spotlight widens. It is suggested that, typically, a State TOY should not be submitted immediately for the National TOY award, but given a year to develop and expand their program impact in order to be more competitive at the national level. Since a State TOY has 2 years of eligibility for the national award, this gives them an opportunity to learn from past National TOY selectees and prepare a well-developed nomination package.
