Provide more than \$336,000 in relief
to over 3,000 people through our Emergency Financial Assistance Programs that provide assistance for heat, electricity, rent, repairs, food assistance and more.

including financial and in-kind assistance.



Provide 4,000+
clothing, furniture and household goods items and vouchers through our Thrift Store to those in need.



Serve almost 11,000 meals
through Friday Night Live Community Dinners, After School Program meals, Addiction Recovery Support Dinner Meetings, Holiday Meals, and Sunday Community meals.



Provide ministry services to incarcerated individuals
and mail Christmas gifts to their children from them. You also helped provide bus passes, clothing and food to those being released.



Make 139 visits
to 17 Assisted Living and Adult Foster Care homes in our region providing fellowship to increase cognitive abilities in the form of music, tea parties, and holiday gifts of cheer.
