This seminar overviews the student safety programming that has been presented to nearly 2 million Michigan children in kindergarten – 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

Students in K - 5<sup>th</sup> grade receive the Michigan Cyber Safety Initiative (CSI), a national, award-winning program that teaches students how to be safe and responsible online.

Students in 6<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> grade receive OK2SAY student safety programming covering topics facing youth today, including appropriate online behavior, cyberbullying, and threats to student well-being.

The goal is to empower students to break the code of silence and submit a confidential tip on criminal activities or potential harm directed at students, school employees, or schools.
