

Rev. Dr. Frank Yates

Dr. Yates graduated from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary in 1975 with an M.Div. He later earned a B.A. in Philosophy from the University of Texas, Austin and did graduate work in philosophy at Texas A&M. He currently teaches in the Religious Studies Program (Theology and New Testament) at UNM. He also teaches Philosophical Ethics and Theology at Lewis University in Albuquerque. He is a well experienced teacher in the EIM/MTS program.



Dr. Howard Ebert

Dr. Howard Ebert began teaching religious studies at St. Norbert College in 1987, specializing in philosophical theology and contemporary Catholic systematic theology. In 1996, he was awarded the Leonard Ledvina Outstanding Teacher Award, an honor he called "humbling; especially considering there are a lot of good teachers here." In 1999, Ebert was named director of the St. Norbert College Master of Theological Studies Program and, in 2000, he was named division chair of Humanities and Fine Arts. Ebert calls teaching at St. Norbert College a "great privilege" and likes sharing ideas with his students and opening up new worlds to them.
