Resources for Rental Assistance Help, Utilities Help, and Eviction Avoidance

St. Vincent De Paul Society (916) 452-4874

Offer: minimal rental assistance under some circumstances. No first or last month rent help.

Salvation Army (916) 678-4050

Offer: rental assistance Monday's only, call from 8:00 am – 11:30 am and 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm

Travelers Aid (916) 399-9646

Offer: rental assistance on every Tuesday and Thursday only from 10:00 am – 11:00 am. Current month's rent only and the off is \$200.00 maximum. No previous months.

SMUD assistance is offered every Monday from 10:00 am – 11:00 am only, but you must have received a disconnect notice or are currently disconnected.

Offer: security deposit and 1st month's rent.

Offer: eviction avoidance assistance, but you must have a received a three-day notice. There may be some funds available for rental assistance.
