#### 7:00 P.M. | LEARN FOR LENT (SEE BELOW FOR LENTEN BIBLE STUDY)\*

Father Stephen will lead the 2018 Bible Study for Lent, "Holy Week according to Mark: A Doorway into the Heart of God." The course is intended to help participants relive the events of the last week of Jesus' earthly life as a way of discovering what God might be about. Here are the sessions:

# 8:15 P.M. | COME FOR COMPLINE

In communities of monks and nuns, Compline is the final church service of the day prior to going to sleep. Our Book of Common Prayer has a version of the service for everyone's daily use. The choir will join us as we end each evening by praying Compline together. If you can't be present physically, join us "virtually" by reading the service from the prayer book on page 127.

Participants are welcome for any or all of each Thursday evening. Come for Worship and stay for Simple Supper. Come for Supper and stay for Learning for Lent. Stop by to pray the ancient monastic night prayers to close out your day. Or make an entire evening of it. People are welcome to drop in as schedules permit.

#### \*Reading the Bible through Lent

Three options are being offered this year: Reading the Minor Prophets, Reading the General Epistles (the ones not written by Paul) and Revelation, and Reading the Four Gospels. A schedule of what to read is provided for those who want to begin this discipline. "Reading the Bible" is self-directed with individuals choosing which of the offerings they would like to begin and deciding when and where to read the scripture passages each day.

### HOLY WEEK AND EASTER SCHEDULE

The journey from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday takes us from the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, to the Last Supper, the Crucifixion, and his glorious Resurrection. Our Holy Week and Easter worship services are a blend of Anglican liturgical traditions and both ancient and contemporary language. All are welcome to participate in worship services at St. Christopher's.
