Pax Trumpanica: When Peace Is Signed Abroad, and Wounds Remain at Home

This analysis examines the gap between high-level peace agreements and the unresolved suffering of African communities affected by violence, calling attention to the Church's indispensable role in reconciliation.

Key insights include:

- Political peace agreements often fail when they ignore justice, memory, and communal healing.
- Catholic parishes and institutions are frontline spaces for trauma healing and accompaniment.
 - Grassroots voices must be centered in peacebuilding processes.
- Authentic reconciliation requires integrating spiritual, psychosocial, and social restoration

Digital Learning Strengthens Catholic Sisters' Impact Across Africa

This report explores how digital learning platforms are reshaping the formation and apostolic effectiveness of women religious across the continent.
