Session 1: The program will highlight the mikveh's biblical roots, construction, the process of immersion, a virtual tour, as well as ancient and contemporary reasons for immersion. The content is taught through the lens of Mayyim Hayyim's mikveh in Newton, MA, but the information is relevant broadly.

Session 2: We will do a deep dive into various Jewish texts on water and transition. All texts will be provided in translation. We will conclude our learning with contemplative journaling and a handwashing ceremony.
