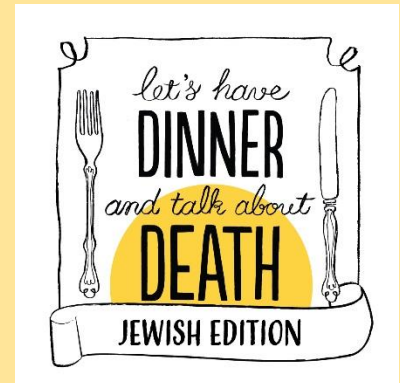

Each person will be invited to light a candle and invoke/honor someone who has died or is on life's edge whom you hold in your heart. Say their name and briefly share how they have impacted you. Everyone will have the opportunity to respond to prompts/conversation starters on the topic. Rabbi Golkow will set the tone with a niggun and some guiding words about the subject.

Rabbi Shayna Golkow is the second rabbi at Temple Aliyah of Los Angeles. She was ordained at the Jewish Theological Seminary in New York City where she also earned a Master's degree in Jewish Education and a Certificate in Pastoral Care and Counseling. As part of her pastoral work, Rabbi Golkow wrote an end-of-life ritual, a "Loved Ones' Vidui," to help families and friends grieve and reconcile with a loss.



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
