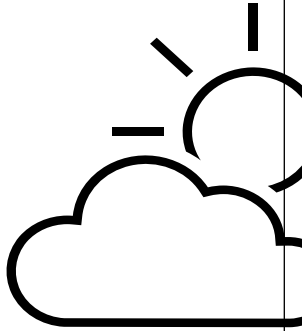

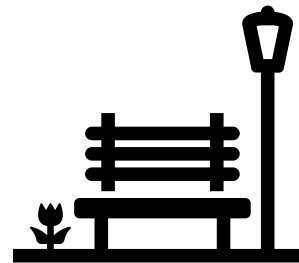

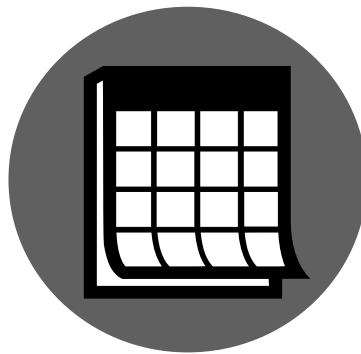


2021 Summer Sermon Series

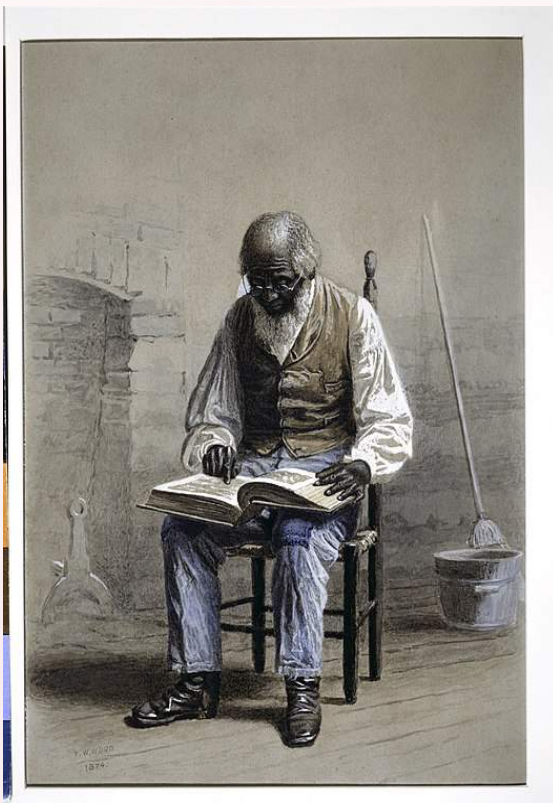
