You will be asked whether you have a library card, and if you do not, you will be asked for a phone number. Type in a mobile phone number. (The service will not work with landlines.) Your Instant Digital Library Card is good for one year. Call the library at 865-982-0981 for help in finding and using R.E.A.D.S. or more information about Instant Digital Library Cards.
