On the cutting edge of global health and disability studies, a term with the Bader International Study Centre offers you the opportunity to see your studies in action, and to explore multiple and varied perspectives to broaden your understanding of vulnerable populations and global health.

- ▶ Immerse yourself in one or more courses and earn up to 9.0 units in a six-week intensive program on the Kingston campus (online if necessary)
- ▶ Expand your knowledge through experiential learning opportunities focused on research and policy, community-based rehabilitation, and mental health
- ▶ Engage with international scholars, researchers, and leaders from world-renowned agencies and expand your global network for internship, volunteer, graduate school, and professional opportunities



COURSES

All classes will run from 8:30 AM-12:30 PM, Monday to Friday inclusive. There may also be some additional times for workshops in the afternoon or early evening, but this will be communicated to registered students closer to the start of term.

- ▶ **May 10th to May 21st** - HLTH 332/3.0 Foundations of Understanding Disability: A Health Perspective **or** HLTH 402/3.0 Disability Studies: Issues, Research and Policy
- ▶ **May 24th to June 4th** - HLTH 403/3.0 Global Perspectives of Community Based Rehabilitation
- ▶ **June 7th to June 18th** - HLTH 404/3.0 Global Studies of Global Inclusion, Community Participation and Mental Illness

Students are encouraged to take all 9.0 units to complete the specialized program, but alternatively have the option to choose to take one or more.

Courses in this program can be used to satisfy requirements for Queen's HLTH Major and Medial plans, and the DIPA Certificate. Students who do not hold the prerequisites for these courses may still be eligible for entry and will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

The interdisciplinary nature of this program attracts students with diverse perspectives and the seminar-style classes allows for in-depth discussion with your professors and classmates. Experiential Learning Opportunities such as trips throughout the Kingston area help you to develop the awareness that is invaluable to personal and professional growth and expands your scope and understanding of global health and disability.

FEES INCLUDE

Fees will be charged in accordance with the Faculty of Arts and Science tuition rates. Depending on mode of delivery, students should budget up to an additional \$500 to participate in off-campus experiential learning which will be dependent on what travel allows.

REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ Good academic standing
- ▶ Level 4 standing and minimum 1.9 GPA **or**
- ▶ Level 3 standing and minimum 2.7 GPA
