Building a Movement to Stop Climate Change

Bill McKibben is an environmentalist, educator, and author. He is the Schumann Distinguished Scholar in Environmental Studies at Middlebury College and a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. A prolific author, his 1989 book, **The End of Nature**, is regarded as the first book for a general audience on climate change. He is the founder of 350.org, the world's largest grassroots campaign to counter the effects of climate change. He writes regularly for a variety of publications, including *The New York Review of Books*, *National Geographic*, and *Rolling Stone*. He has earned numerous honors for his writing, which include membership in the Literature section of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the John Steinbeck prize. He was awarded the Gandhi Prize, the Thomas Merton Prize, and the Right Livelihood Prize, and he has received honorary degrees from 18 colleges and universities. He lives in Vermont in the mountains above Lake Champlain.
