In the Lion's Den: Finding Faith and Integrity During Tough Times

It's easy to remain faithful when times are easy. It's easy to follow Christ when it doesn't impact our schedule, our comfort, or our own hopes and dreams. The Prophet Daniel, a Jewish exile living in Babylon, asked these very questions as he was being led to the lion's den. But Daniel's faith in God during those times, as well as God's provision for Daniel, shows us how powerful our faith can be. For 4 weeks, we will explore the 6th chapter of Daniel, as well as the 8th chapter of Romans, to see how relying on our faith leads to integrity, which then gives us the ability to navigate tough times while remaining faithful to God.
