OUR BUILDINGS ARE OLD AND NEED CRITICAL UPDATES

Many of our schools have served students for over a century, with the most recent major updates happening decades ago. Over time, critical issues have emerged, such as failing plumbing and outdated electrical systems, worn-out windows and doors and aging HVAC systems that all need updating. Changing safety and security needs and accessibility standards have also made improvements necessary. The bond referendum will address these challenges districtwide, ensuring our schools can meet the needs of students now and in the future.

Overcrowded classrooms and limited space mean some students are taught in hallways and stairwells, disrupting learning and limiting opportunities. The RenewD102 plan alleviates overcrowding districtwide, providing every student the space to learn and thrive.


PUTTING OUR SCHOOLS FIRST HELPS THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY
