



### What was the News in 1923?

*This year we are reporting on interesting items in the 1923 Smithville Democrat Herald, on microfilm at the Clay County Archives in Liberty.*

**November 3, 1923** The Smithville Athletics, a recently organized football team lost to the Excelsior Springs American Legion Team 6 to 0. The Smithville High School Tommies football team beat Lathrop 12 to 0. A revival at the Christian Church is underway. A choir of young ladies from all local churches is drawing a crowd. The Clay County Commissioners have inspected the bridge over the Little Platte River on Bridge Street and determined it is badly in need of repairs. As the State Highway Dept. is short on funds the county will do the repair work on the floor and bannisters. This is a safety issue as the bridge has a large amount of daily traffic.

**November 9, 1923** Hibbard Taul of Smithville received a gold medal from the Farm Bureau and first prize at the County fair for have the highest pig production. James Strange, a Smithville Freshman, was injured at a football game in Warrenburg and is not confined to a wheelchair. The Tommies were decisively defeated by Liberty 54 to 6. Smithville's sole score occurred when halfback Millis picked up a fumbled ball from kickoff and ran eighty yards for the touchdown.
