Volunteers must complete an <u>application</u>, interview, background check, volunteer orientation, and additional trainings/requirements depending on the opportunity.

#### **Visitor Center Host**

Staff the Visitor Center, answer questions, provide park information, interpret the history of the family, the ranch and the artifacts in the Visitor Center. Great for those who like interacting with people, sharing their knowledge, learning, and being indoors! There is an opportunity to lead formal interpretive programs as a docent with additional training.
