

Patrol Highlights:

On 04/03/2020, California Highway Patrol transferred a call of a report of a stolen vehicle coming into Marysville. The vehicle was a 2017 Chevrolet Sonic, equipped with On Star. On Star Dispatch guided officers to the area of East 22nd Street and Jean Drive and continued to provide update information as the Chevrolet traveled west on East 22nd Street. Officer's spotted the Chevrolet at East 22nd Street and Huston Street, at which point On-Star was able to disable the Chevrolet and activate all of the Chevrolet's lights. Officer's conducted a high-risk vehicle stop on the Chevrolet. The suspect, a parolee, was taken into custody without incident. The Chevrolet was recovered, and the suspect was booked into Yuba County Jail for theft of a motor vehicle, possession of stolen property, and a parole violation.

On 04/10/2020 at approximately 1005 hours, Dispatch received several 911 calls of a domestic disturbance with shots fired in the 100 block of 7th Street. Officers arrived on scene along with YCSO deputies and YCSO command staff, who all heard the shots from their office. Officers located several uncooperative people. Officers also located the victim who was unharmed. It was determined through an exhaustive investigation that the suspect was involved in an altercation with the victim and attempted to shoot him while he was driving away. The suspect was identified by detectives. On 04/11/2020 the suspect got into a shootout with the Sacramento Police Department while they tried to arrest him for the crimes committed in Marysville. The suspect was wounded by the Sacramento Police Department. The suspect is currently in the Sacramento Police Department's custody and being treated.

On 04/12/2020, there was a drive by shooting at 507 E 16th Street. There was one male victim who was shot in the leg. The victim was treated at Rideout for non-life threatening medical treatment.

On 04/13/2020, there was a 911 call of an unresponsive female who was believed to be deceased. Officers arrived on scene and located the female laying on the floor. The female had a pale and bluish tone colored skin and had a faint pulse. The female was cold to the touch and was not breathing. Officers gave the female two sprays of Narcan but she was still was not breathing on her own. Officers began CPR on the female. Officer's utilized an AMBU bag and gave her oxygen. The female eventually gained consciousness. Bi-county ambulance arrived on scene and took over patient care.
