

Patrol Highlights:

On October 4, 2020, there was a call of a shooting near the 1100 block of Ramirez St. A reporting party (RP) advised a male who was on foot shot at his vehicle while he was driving. Officers arrived in the area and ascertained who the suspect was based on his description. Officers contacted the RP and found one bullet hole through the passenger side that lodged into his vehicle dashboard. Officers tracked the juvenile suspect who was found to be on felony probation. Officers conducted a search of the juvenile's residence, locating the stolen .45 caliber handgun that was used during the shooting. The suspect was booked into juvenile hall for attempted homicide and possession of a stolen firearm.

On October 8, 2020, Officers responded to a suspect that had chased a victim with a knife. Officers arrived on scene and found the suspect holding the knife at the victim. The suspect was held at gunpoint and eventually taken into custody. The suspect was booked into jail for several felony crimes.

On October 15, 2020, several officers responded to the Hollywood Trailer Park and completed several evacuations for a large fire that broke out. Officers also contended with several vehicle collisions, fights, and power outages during this time.

The week of October 26, 2020, the Department partnered with Recology Yuba-Sutter, Public Works, Fire Department, Bi-County HEART Team, and SAYlove and completed a clean-up operation in Hollywood Trailer Park due to the recent fire. A total of 106 vehicles and trailers were removed from this location along with 52.49 tons of garbage and debris. Patrol personnel continue to patrol and monitor this location as fire and public works personnel continue to complete additional mitigation.

The Department saw a complaint on Facebook regarding trash piled up and accumulating underneath the 10th Street Bridge at Featherside Drive. Sergeant Culver acting quickly with his team and Public Works and had this debris removed.
