

ArriveCAN Checklist

All travellers, with limited exceptions, whether entering Canada by air or land, **must** use ArriveCAN. Travellers will need to submit their information within 72 hours before your arrival to Canada. This document is intended to assist clients in compiling the necessary information they will need to enter into ArriveCAN in advance of the 72-hour window.

- required contact information for you and other people travelling with you
- the purpose of your travel
- travel details:
 - date of arrival
 - port of entry if entering by land **or** flight number/airport and airline
- vaccination information and proof of vaccination
 - details (date, country, type) of your first dose
 - details (date, country, type) of your second dose, if required
 - a photo or PDF proof of vaccination (receipt, card, confirmation, etc.) for each dose
- information about the countries you stayed in or visited in the 14 days prior to your arrival in Canada
- a quarantine plan, just in case

Fully vaccinated travellers must still have a quarantine plan in the event that they do not meet eligibility requirements. Final determination of whether or not a person qualifies for the full vaccination exemption is made by a government representative at the border.

For your quarantine plan, the ArriveCAN questions include:

- accommodations, including address
- manner of avoiding contact with others while in quarantine
- access to basic necessities of life, including water, food, medication and heat, without leaving quarantine
- who may be at the quarantine location, and if there are people at increased risk from COVID-19 at the location of quarantine

NOTE

Fully vaccinated may receive notifications in ArriveCAN after arrival regarding testing and quarantine. If the person is entering under the fully vaccinated exemption, they can ignore these notifications.
