Floating down a river in a raft or tube is an Oregon summer tradition. A tradition that is a lot more fun when the river isn't packed with other floaters. Putting in along the Clackamas River near Estacada is easy and only a short trip from Portland.

The water recreation options range from flat water lakes to whitewater rapids, so you can choose your adventure, be it kayaking, paddleboarding, fishing or spending a lazy afternoon on a pontoon boat.

The Oregon Department of Transportation recently reopened Highway 224 up to Ripplebrook, making several of the boat launch and day use areas accessible again. From north to south, the open sites include Timber Park in Estacada, North Fork Reservoir boat launch, Promontory Park


