Scripture Reflection...

The Transfiguration is the critical turning point of Jesus' public ministry. Behind him now was the success of his Galilean ministry, his preaching was eloquent, the miracles were dazzling and, large crowds followed wherever he went. Then he let it all go, and set his sights on Jerusalem where he would march into the jaws of death. He knew he was on a collision course with the authorities who were determined to kill him. There seemed to be no way out of the impending disaster. How could it all end like this?

It is at this point that Jesus took Peter, James and John along with him to pray for understanding on the mountain top. In the midst of intense prayer, Jesus was transfigured so that his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And Moses and Elijah appeared conversing with him. In Luke's Gospel, we are told they were discussing Jesus' passage from this life to the next.

What, we might ask, is going on here? The Transfiguration is best understood as an interior spiritual experience Jesus had that resulted in external bodily effects. The aura of light surrounding Jesus was the result of a profound discovery on his part. It is as if something obscure and puzzling had suddenly become wonderfully meaningful. This profound, mystical discovery on the part of Jesus was that God would bring Messianic salvation to the world not in the human way of power and miracles but through the complete and utter vulnerability of the loving sacrifice of the cross.

In each of our lives, there is a time of an insightful "mountain top experience": a wonder-filled sense of wellbeing flowing from God's comforting and assuring presence. For most of us, it is like a brief shooting star, for others it is an abiding flame that brings insight and meaning to the challenging mystery of life. In the final analysis however, we are saved not by visions of transfiguration, but by the mystery of Jesus coming out of the earth at the Resurrection.

God calls all of us to leave behind our old ways and to follow Him, placing our complete trust in Him. Some of the old ways that we struggle to leave behind might be materialism, selfishness and greed. Yet, God promises to show us a new land and a better way to live. Remember what St. Teresa of Calcutta said, "God does not call us to be successful, God calls us to be faithful."

Statement of Most Reverend Nelson J. Perez on the One-Year Anniversary of the Russian Invasion of Ukraine

One year ago today, Russia launched its invasion of Ukraine. Peace was shattered. Unnecessary pain and anguish were unleashed. As a society, our hearts are heavy with sadness to witness the ongoing conflict and the senseless loss of so many innocent lives.

On behalf of all people in the Church of Philadelphia, I express our continued prayerful solidarity with those embroiled by the conflict in Ukraine as well as Ukrainians in our region and throughout the world.

The fortitude and infinite hope of the Ukrainian people shines brightly in these dark times. May they be strengthened by God's grace.

I ask all people of goodwill to join me in praying fervently for an end to the suffering and devastation in Eastern Europe. May God pour His mercy on those in distress and may our Blessed Mother, the Queen of Peace, wrap them in her comforting mantle.



PARISH ANNIVERSARY

In August, our parish will celebrate its 175th anniversary. On our website you can read an in-depth description of our history. The official parish registry opened with the first Baptism on August 15, 1848, establishing the parish of St. Thomas of Villanova. The church building at Villanova was completed in 1887, and renovated in 1943. In 1900 the Rosemont Chapel was built for the convenience of the parishioners and the clergy who ministered to them, and in 1908 the Augustinians opened a school for children of the parish in Rosemont. The present Rosemont Chapel was completed in 1956 and renovated in 2000. In 1992 the Villanova church underwent a major renovation, and in 2020 was repainted. In 2022 the Rosemont Chapel was also repainted with some minor renovations.

Preparations are underway to celebrate this milestone. Suggestions and ideas for doing so are welcomed if you'd like to submit them to the parish office via email or letter.

TITLE: CHRISTIAN ART AT THE PHILADELPHIA ART MUSEUM


**PRESENTER: Dr. John Immerwahr — a Docent at the Art Museum.
