

# OUR LORD, JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

## NOVEMBER 21, 2021



### Scripture Reflection...

#### CHRIST THE KING

Recently there was a movie in which the same story was told from the perspective of each of the three main characters. It was intriguing to see how the same circumstances could be so differently interpreted. The key to the movie's meaning was the credibility of each character. As we were introduced to each of them, we got a sense of their motivation and their apparent intention. But in the end, it was up to the viewer to make the decision about whom to believe.

Today's Gospel account has somewhat of the same feeling as that movie. We have the Roman Governor, representing political power, asking the question, "Are you the King of the Jews," and then Jesus, the prisoner brought before him, accused of challenging this political power by those not present but prominent in the background, that is, the religious authorities, representing the Jewish faith. Three angles: Pilate of Rome, Caiaphas of Jerusalem, Jesus of Nazareth. Pilate, a Roman steeped in the trappings of Roman pomp and ceremony, knew a king to be like the emperor who saw himself a god. The heritage of the Jewish authorities taught them to await a Messiah who would overcome Roman oppression; they found the Roman notion reprehensible. And so when Jesus is brought before Pilate as the King of the Jews, he is dubious and the Jews are incensed by the blasphemy.

"Are YOU the King of the Jews?" Pilate asks, incredulous that this obviously poor, powerless peasant could be considered a king. Is this what the Jews consider leadership material? One can imagine the look of absolute disdain on his face as he asked the question, for from his perspective, the Jews had to be deluding themselves. From the viewpoint of the chief priests, however, it was blasphemy. How dare the Romans even entertain the possibility of this rabble-rouser as their king! While Pilate asks Jesus his questions out of sheer astonishment, Jesus responds with the logical response that Pilate doesn't understand who he really is. It's the equivalent of the old apples and oranges routine. "You're a King? You say I am a king, but my kingdom is not what you think it is. So then you ARE a king? No, you SAY I am a king, but my kingdom is beyond the empty, pompous idea that Rome has of leadership. If you accepted the truth, you'd know what I'm talking about. But you can't understand me because you don't see the truth." So the moral of the story is that the listener has to ask, "Whom do I believe? What am I looking for? Do I understand how Jesus is King and what his Kingdom is about?"

It all comes down to credibility. For those who base their values on power, status, greed, oppression and the like, the only plausible king is one who answers to no one and has absolute power to do whatever he wants. For those who are blind to the truth about the Messiah as one who brings justice, peace and dignity through love of God and love of neighbor, and who insist on awaiting a Messiah like King David and his triumphal warrior image, the notion of a leader whose power derives from service and compassion is preposterous. The feast of Christ the King is for us the omega point of our liturgical year, the ultimate resolution of what we believe about Jesus as our guide and example. Is he the Messiah-King whose purpose is to lead us to ultimate peace and justice? Is this our first priority in everyday life as well? Or do we define the power of Jesus Christ as the world sees a king? Who is Christ the King for us? And just like the movie, whom we believe depends on whose perspective is consistent with what we believe.

When a divorce occurs, the Catholic Church always seeks to balance two realities. One is the unbreakableness of the bond of marriage. This is God's law. It cannot be broken by human intervention. On the other hand, the Church is concerned about the spiritual welfare of the people involved. Was this a true marriage? Even though a Catholic marriage was celebrated, was there perhaps some deficiency in the consent of the parties involved? The annulment procedure addresses this problem.
