

THE DIGNITY ACT

TOUGH. FAIR. NOT AMNESTY.

Amnesty means a free pass, taxpayer benefits, and no accountability.
The Dignity Act does none of the above.

NO PATH TO CITIZENSHIP

- No green cards. No pathway to citizenship.
- Provides temporary, controlled legal status only.
- Participation does not lead to U.S. citizenship or ability to vote.
- Separate provision: Dreamers may earn permanent status only if they meet strict requirements.

NO FEDERAL BENEFITS

- No access to welfare or taxpayer-funded programs.
- Participants are not eligible for federal entitlements.
- Must work, support themselves, and contribute.

ZERO TOLERANCE FOR CRIMINALS

- Mandatory background checks for every applicant — no exceptions.
- Any serious criminal record or gang affiliation = automatic disqualification.
- Any criminal conduct = immediate removal from the program and deportation proceedings.
- No protection, no leniency — criminals are identified, prioritized, and removed.

NO FREE PASS – ACCOUNTABILITY

- Must come forward, register with DHS, and admit unlawful presence.
- Submit biometrics and full security vetting.
- Failure to comply = enforcement and removal.

NATIONAL SECURITY – WE KNOW WHO IS HERE

- Moves millions into a tracked, vetted system.
- Gives law enforcement visibility and control.
- Ends today's unmonitored status quo.

EARNED STATUS – NOT A HANDOUT

- Requires \$7,000 in restitution — you pay steep fines and penalties.
- Includes an additional 1% income contribution.
- Must work legally, pay taxes, and remain in good standing.
- Status is temporary, conditional, and earned.
- Fully funded by participant contributions — not taxpayers.

ENFORCEMENT BUILT INTO LAW

- Ends catch-and-release for asylum seekers.
- Cases decided within 60 days.
- Penalties for fraud and repeat abuse.

ASYLUM REFORM – ENDS ABUSE

- Must come forward, register with DHS, and admit unlawful presence.
- Submit biometrics and full security vetting.
- Failure to comply = enforcement and removal.

AMERICA FIRST – PROTECTS WORKERS

- Ends illegal labor that undercuts wages.
- \$70B workforce fund for U.S. workers.
- At least one American worker trained per participant.

The Dignity Act is not amnesty – it is a structured, enforceable framework grounded in accountability and the rule of law.
