# A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of State to establish a strategy for monitoring the general elections in the Republic of Honduras to take place on November 30, 2025, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

# **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protect Honduran De-
- 5 mocracy Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

7 It is the sense of Congress that—

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1 (1) the 2025 election process in the Republic of 2 Honduras raises serious concerns about the fairness 3 of the electoral process, including irregularities with 4 the March 2025 primary election, violence against 5 candidates and the actions undertaken by security 6 and defense forces under the ongoing state of emer-7 gency, including serious human rights violations 8 which undermine the conditions of the election;

9 (2) there is a need for the United States to 10 support efforts to ensure elections in the Republic of 11 Honduras to take place on November 30, 2025, are 12 free and fair; and

(3) the armed forces of Honduras and other relevant institutions with a role in the electoral process
should respect their role within the confines of the
constitution of Honduras and protect the democratic
process.

18 SEC. 3. STRATEGY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State shall establish a strategy to promote free and fair elections in
Honduras to take place on November 30, 2025.

(b) MATTERS TO BE INCLUDED.—The strategy required by subsection (a) shall include support for monitoring the elections by credible and internationally recognized elections monitoring bodies, such as the Organiza-

tion of American States, the European Union, the United 1 2 Nations, and experienced civil society observers and others to achieve the following: 3 4 (1) Ensure that candidates to public office are 5 not subject to harassment, undue legal persecution 6 or other efforts to misuse state resources to dissuade 7 them or undermine their candidacies. 8 (2) Avoid the misuse of state resources aimed 9 at influencing voter preferences. 10 (3) Avoid the use of violence and intimidation, 11 including by transnational criminal organizations, 12 local gangs, or political parties and their proxies. 13 (4) Guarantee freedom of speech and assembly. 14 Ensure transparent and credible trans-(5)15 mission of elections results.

#### 16 SEC. 4. ASSISTANCE.

The President, acting through the Secretary of State,
is authorized to provide assistance on a grant basis to nongovernmental organizations for activities—

20 (1) to monitor the national elections in Hon21 duras to take place on November 30, 2025; and

(2) to assess the extent to which these electionsare held on a free and fair basis.

# 1 SEC. 5. SANCTIONS.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The President shall impose the
3 sanctions described in subsection (b) with respect to any
4 foreign person, including any current or former official of
5 the Government of Honduras or any person acting on be6 half of that Government, that the President determines—

7 (1) has unduly prevented, or is responsible for
8 ordering or otherwise directing the undue prevention
9 of, any candidate, or prospective candidate, in the
10 general elections in Honduras to take place on No11 vember 30, 2025;

(2) has knowingly materially assisted, sponsored, or provided significant financial, material, or
technological support for, or goods or services in
support of, the commission of the acts described in
paragraph (1); or

17 (3) has carried out acts of intimidation or har18 assment toward candidates, election officials, or elec19 tion observers, including through the use of spurious
20 legal action.

21 (b) SANCTIONS DESCRIBED.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The sanctions described in
this subsection are, in the case of an alien determined by the President to be subject to subsection
(a), denial of a visa to, and exclusion from the
United States of, the alien, and revocation in accord-

1	ance with section 221(i) of the Immigration and Na-
2	tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1201(i)), of any visa or other
3	documentation of the alien.
4	(2) EXCEPTIONS.—The sanctions described in
5	paragraph (1) shall not apply with respect to a for-
6	eign person that—
7	(A) the President determines is the subject
8	of other sanctions equivalent to those described
9	in paragraph (1); or
10	(B) is an alien, if admitting the alien into
11	the United States is necessary to permit the
12	United States to comply with the Agreement re-
13	garding the Headquarters of the United Na-
14	tions, signed at Lake Success June 26, 1947,
15	and entered into force November 21, 1947, be-
16	tween the United Nations and the United
17	States, or other applicable international obliga-
18	tions.
19	(c) WAIVER.—The President may waive the applica-
20	tion of sanctions under subsection (b) with respect to a
21	foreign person if the President—
22	(1) determines that such a waiver is in the na-
23	tional interest of the United States; and
24	(2) on or before the date on which the waiver
25	takes effect, submits to the Committee on Foreign

Relations and the Committee on Appropriations of
 the Senate and the Committee on Foreign Affairs
 and the Committee on Appropriations of the House
 of Representatives a notice of and justification for
 the waiver.

6 (d) REGULATORY AUTHORITY.—The President shall
7 issue such regulations, licenses, and orders as are nec8 essary to carry out this section.

# 9 SEC. 6. PROMOTION OF MIGRANT PARTICIPATION IN ELEC-

# 10 TIONS.

11 Congress encourages the Secretary of State to pro-12 mote the ability of citizens of Honduras residing in the 13 United States to vote in the general elections in Honduras 14 to take place on November 30, 2025.

#### 15 SEC. 7. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

16 It is the sense of Congress that the President should 17 continue to seek to coordinate with other countries, par-18 ticularly Central American countries, a comprehensive, 19 multilateral strategy to further the purposes of this Act, 20 including, as appropriate, encouraging other countries to 21 take measures with respect to Honduras that are similar 22 to measures described in this Act.
