Born and raised in the Deep South and now a resident of BC's Lower Mainland, Farr has not forgotten the grinding grit of the Delta and puts it to great use in this project. This album showcases an electrified, haunting taste of Bentonia blues, of which R.C is a natural master.

Big Dave McLean *Pocket Full of Nothin'* Black Hen

Saskatchewan-born, Winnipeg-based **Big Dave** is the godfather of Prairie blues, and his latest collection of songs, mostly original this time, ranges from horn-powered jump to roots music at its best. **Steve Dawson** produces and plays up a storm on this tour de force.



As we used to say on the playground, it don't mean a thing if it ain't got that swing. From **Borealis Records** comes a 22-track album of previously unreleased Jackie Washington recordings, plus a DVD of I Want to Be Happy, a 2006 documentary by Ari Cohen that tells the life story of the melodious swingmaster musician.

Holley-George Warren "Janis" Simon and Schuster

We learn from a new biography that in Port Arthur, Texas, during the fifties and early sixties, a "tomboy" **Janis Joplin** would rip off her shirt to roughhouse with the neighborhood boys. An allegory, perhaps, for This year's highlighted state is South Carolina, which means music and essays on the part of the world that brought us **Dizzy Gillespie**, **Eartha Kitt**, the **Marshall Tucker Band** and **Reverend Gary Davis**. Daniel Tate and Rob Bowman *The Flyer Vault* Dundurn

This glorious book covers the history of Toronto concerts in almost every genre other than classical music. The research is meticulous, the artwork of concert bills and posters is fascinating, and the writing is lively. **Bowman** and **Tate** have outdone themselves

Colin James was 12 and Colin Linden was 16 when they first met. Both continue to record brilliant blues-based albums that are highly recommended as well.

Manx Marriner Mainline Hell Bound for Heaven Stony Plain

A n o t h e r m u s i c a l partnership that grew and matured over the years. Harry Manx met Steve Marriner in Ottawa when Steve was a teen and over the years they have toured internationally and finally recorded this duet album.

Delbert

McClinton *Tall, Dark & Handsome* Hot Shot/ Thirty Tigers

Nominated for the Traditional Grammy, **Delbert** is back with one of the best albums of his long career. There is no one who mixes Texas roadhouse and big band blues better. Delbert is a brilliant songwriter, singer and bandleader. I also recommended his autobiography of last year.

Tammy L. Turner "Dick Waterman - A Life in Blues" University Press of Mississippi

Dick Waterman is a blues hero. He rediscovered Son House and went on to work with Miss. Fred McDowell, Miss. John Hurt, Buddy Guy & Jr. Wells, Bonnie Raitt, BB King and many more. His love of blues and the artists he's worked with provide great insight and his photos are classic.

He is only 20, born in Clarksdale and a product of the Delta Museum music program. It's almost too good to be true but one listen will tell you it is very true. Kingfish is nominated for the Traditional Blues Grammy and is #1 on

MOJO magazine's Blues Top Ten. He is also nominated for the Maple Blues Award's BB King International Artist of the Year category. He's playing the Horseshoe on March 8, 2020.

Various Artists Ann Arbor Blues Festival 1969 Third Man Imagine, if you will, a weekend blues festival with BB King, Muddy Waters, Big Mama Thornton, Howlin' Wolf, Fred McDowell, Lightnin' Hopkins, Son House and many more, two weeks before Woodstock, 50 years ago. It was recorded, two CDs or LPs.

Various Artists Cadillac Baby's Bea & Baby's Records-The Complete Collection Earwig

Narvel Eatmon, Cadillac Baby, and his wife Bea, were black entrepreneurs in the South Side of Chicago. He recorded what his customers wanted and they were particular. James Cotton, Hound Dog Taylor, Little Mack Simmons, Sunnyland Slim and many more hard-to-find singles spread over four discs with a great 128-page book.

Bruce Conforth & Gayle Dean Wardlow "Up Jumped the Devil-The Real Life of Robert Johnson" Chicago Review Press


After decades of speculation and mythologizing, we now have the definitive story behind the legend, even a picture of the cabin where he was born.

There was a special broadcast on Saturday, November 23rd from 3 – 5 pm MT, hosted by Grant Stovel featuring an in-depth interview with Holger himself, plus live music and contributions from many of his friends and colleagues including Amos Garrett, Kat Danser, and Mike McDonald of Jr. Gone Wild. As if that was not enough, he was feted on his 70th birthday and will soon add another trophy to his collection: Folk Alliance International (FAI) has named him a winner at this year's International Folk Music Awards, inducting him into the Folk DJ Hall of Fame, in recognition of Petersen's long career as a roots music radio host.

"Almost" to be inducted into Canadian Songwriters Hall of Fame: The first

Canadian blues recording ever to sell gold, "I've Got Everything I Need (Almost)," written by The Legendary SONGWRITERS Downchild Blues Band's leader and

co-founder, Don Walsh, was inducted into the Canadian Songwriters Hall of Fame (CSHF) at the National Arts Centre in Ottawa on Friday, November 29, 2019. The song skyrocketed to international fame when it was covered by The Blues Brothers' Dan Aykroyd and the late John Belushi, who were heavily influenced by the Canadian group founded in 1969. The song induction will take place during the band's 50th Anniversary Party in Ottawa on Nov. 29, featuring special guests Dan Aykroyd, Tony D (Monkey Junk), Suzie Vinnick and Andy J Forest.

"It's such an honour to have "I've Got Everything I Need (Almost)" chosen to be inducted into the Canadian Songwriters Hall of Fame. When you write a song, you have no idea what kind of effect it will have on people and for some reason this song really connected with fans. Having my friend Dan Aykroyd record it with The Blues Brothers definitely helped give it greater exposure worldwide, which was exciting," said Don Walsh. "As a songwriter, it's the ultimate to have one of your songs selected to be in the Hall of Fame, alongside some of the greatest songwriters of our time, not only in Canada but internationally, like Leonard Cohen, Joni Mitchell, Gordon Lightfoot and Neil Young. It just doesn't get any better than that!"

Downchild first released I've Got Everything I Need (Almost), penned by Don Walsh, on their "Straight Up" album in 1973. Their label, GRT, later remixed the cut in 1974 as a 45-rpm single titled Almost, as a followup to their first single, the infectious Top 40 hit "Flip, Flop and Fly". Almost featured Don Walsh's "York County" on the B side. With its winning combination of "jump" and Chicago blues, "Almost" quickly became a favourite of radio stations in March 1974.

"Almost" led Downchild to tour clubs and colleges extensively in Canada. Further success came when Walsh's pal Dan Aykroyd covered the hit song with his new act The Blues Brothers on their 1978 album "Briefcase Full of Blues." The late John Belushi took the vocals, with Aykroyd on harmonica and the expertise of Thunder Bay-born Paul Shaffer (of TV's David Letterman show) on keyboards. The Blues Brothers' appearance on TV's "Saturday Night Live" propelled the album to Billboard's No. 1 position in February 1979.


Boom. Toronto night life lovers

The Victory Theatre located on the north east corner of Dundas and Spadina will be enjoying a massive renovation by Yorkville (Boa Cafe) promoter Rony Hitti. Also art deco in design and active as Victory Burlesque as well as the Standard Theatre, the building dates back to 1921. A 20 year lease is the backbone of the approach that will allow capacity to flex from 1050 down to 600. Just up the street we have seen reported recently that El Mocambo owner Michael Wekerle has been delayed by permit approvals with the City of Toronto but has one more to go before an early 2020 opening. The 1910 building evolved into a bar in 1948 and has housed some of the most notorious cont'd on p9

Blues Booster

Brian Blain

For every musician who manages to make a living playing music full time, there's a dozen more who had to take on a real job – and if they're lucky they find a regular paycheck in a less glamorous corner of the music business. Some play part-time (aka week-end warriors) and others are satisfied to be making music with their buddies in basement studios all across the city and the suburbs.

Brian Blain is receiving the Blues Booster Award for more than 25 years of service behind the scenes editing and publishing music newsletters and websites and being the go-to desktop publishing and I.T. guy for numerous music organizations including the Toronto Blues Society, The Toronto Jazz Festival and the Toronto Musicians' Association. All while juggling a career as a recording artist and playing enough gigs "to keep the circulation going."

He arrived in Toronto in 1990 but has spent the last 50 years in the music business behind the scenes - managing, producing and playing bass for other artists, writing songs and occasionally putting them out on CD (his 5^{th} CD is due in January).

Brian came up on the sidelines and that's where he's most comfortable. Studying string bass at 15, making his first record in 1963, he's been a sideman, manager, producer, editor, publisher, blogger and tireless promoter of local blues artists through his long-running "Campfire Jams."

His first CD was recorded in 1999 when some of Toronto's finest players thought he should record some of his thoughtful, often funny chronicles of life. They all played for free in an out-of-town studio which was also provided for free in gratitude for Brian's part in collecting a large amount of back-royalties that were due to the studio owner, Frazier Mohawk – who produced Brian's first solo release in 1973.

Brian's next CD came out on the Northern Blues label after label owner Fred Litwin heard Brian's first CD. Litwin had hired Brian to put together a website and media list for the new label.

Brian has been chronicling the blues scene since he got to Toronto in 1990 – blogging and writing songs about the musicians he's worked with like Scott "Professor Piano" Cushnie, Paul Reddick, Kathi MacDonald and the audience favourite, "Last Time I Saw Lenny (Breau)" as well as moaning about the sad state of the music business causing Jeffrey Morgan to write in the Detroit Times, "Now here's something you don't hear every day: a bluesman singin' the blues about how lousy the blues singin' business is these days."

Over the course of his performing career, he has toured most of Canada and a lot of the States as well as 3 tours of Germany, the last time with the late Kathi MacDonald (long-time band mate of Long John Baldry). Brian also had the opportunity to gig with Baldry and jam with blues legends like Mel Brown and Hubert Sumlin who told him, "I've got ears. I listen. You've got something, Brian. Something good. I'm not going to forget you."

Brian's guitar style has evolved slowly and effortlessly, without much practising (unlike most modern guitarists). He's never owned a wah-wah pedal, doesn't use slide or alternate tunings and the closest thing to a guitar lesson that he ever had was an instructional book/record called *The Art of the Folk Blues Guitar*. "And 50 years later, I'm still playing some of those tunes - on the same guitar", he says.

At 73, Brian has slowed down a bit but is still an enduring presence on the blues scene, playing when he can and supporting his fellow bluesicians at every opportunity, being a true Booster of the Blues.






Angel Forrest Hell Bent with Grace Ad Litteram

Now in her 50's, Angel Forrest has decided to confront her age Hell Bent with Grace. Partner Denis Coulombe is right there with her along with lead guitarist Ricky Paquette as the songwriting trio. Coulombe is on acoustic rhythm guitar and Paquette plays almost everything else barring Alec McElcheran on bass and Sly Coulombe on drums and a rocking blues album is what we get - hell bent it surely is. The subject matter of the songs is all Angel, tackling menopause in "Menie the Monster", keeping the party going at any cost on "Get It On", the first single; "Bea" contemplates the possible life of a waitress she observes at a small club in Chicago; "Ain't No Doubt" analyzes her current relationship and with its attractive tune it perhaps should be the next single. She tackles a mental health problem in a loved one with great honesty in "The Blame Game". It too has an attractive melody, "Looking Glass" is one rocking confidence booster. "Bane Lorraine" channels a great deal of anger at someone trying to steal her man. Thirty years into her career she still wants to get out there and rock and that she does with most everything around her fair game to write about. Paquette nails his lead guitar parts, underscoring her every emotion. Her web site is www.angelforrest.ca and shows mostly Quebec dates for now.

Jackie Washington The World of Jackie Washington CD/DVD Borealis

November 12 was the one hundredth

anniversary of Jackie Washington's birth. Ken Whiteley, who is largely responsible for the late career success of the Hamilton legend, has assembled an impressive package to celebrate. Although Ken had caught Jackie at a folk festival in 1966 and accompanied him frequently afterwards, it was only in 1991 that the formal trio we've come to know was established. Where Old Friends Meet was the hugely popular debut of the Scarlett, Washington & Whiteley and led to a JUNO nomination in the Roots and Traditional category (the year before the blues Juno started). More albums and tours followed and as it became obvious that Jackie knew hundreds of songs including several more he wrote, even more recording sessions were arranged. The World of



Jackie Washington contains 19 previously unreleased songs plus three new tributes from Ken, Colin Linden and Cathy Fink & Marcy Marxer. Jackie's music, the popular hits of early in the last century, often learned directly from the composers, was always upbeat, humourous, feel-good music and these songs make welcome additions to his discography. Accompanying Jackie are some the finest players you are likely to hear: Victor Bateman, Graham Townsend, Mose Scarlett, Reg Schwager and of course, the Whiteley clan. The second disc is a 2006 documentary by Ari A. Cohen called I Want to Be Happy: The Jackie Washington Story. Originally made for Bravo Television in 2005, Cohen has produced a masterful hour on Jackie and the Washington clan. Interviews with Jackie and family members including nephew Harrison Kennedy bring his story to life. Longtime Manager Bill Powell sums it up by saying his story is the story of music in Hamilton. The package also contains a brief but well-written history of Jackie's life by Ken who also organized a Hugh's Room celebration featuring Sneezy Waters, Chris Whiteley, John Sheard and himself plus other guests on November 17.I hope it too was preserved. Bywater Call Gypsy Soul

Meghan Parnell and Dave Barnes' band, Bywater Call, first came to our attention with the 2018 Talent Search. Led by Parnell's magnificent voice and Barnes' fluid slide guitar, they won rather handily. They've also been gigging regularly including at some major blues festivals, building a following large enough to use Hugh's Room for the CD launch held on Nov. 22. All this gigging has also led to a nomination in the New Artist category for the MBAs. They have two horns and a very impressive set of original songs. Bruce McCarthy plays drums, Mike Meusel plays bass and Alan Zemaitis is on keys. The two horn players are Stephen Dyte on trumpet and Julian Nalli on tenor making for an absolutely superb unit. Drawing on the sounds of the Allman Brothers and Tedeschi Trucks Band and blending that with their version of the Stax sound of Memphis and Muscle Shoals in Alabama, they've found a rich vein to explore. Over a muted slide and organ intro, the rest of the band soon kicks in on Parnell's rousing plea not to be passed over, that she has what he needs, making "Arizona" a tremendous set opener. Label mates Samantha Martin & Delta Sugar are on hand for superb background vocals. "Forgive" finds Parnell on the other side, asking forgiveness for her admitted transgressions, another powerful rocker. A major highlight is "Talking Backwards", there is an annoying person who just won't leave and Parnell has decided to talk backwards until he does. The band here just smokes. Somewhat slower is the first single, "Walk on By", a well-written song rejecting the advances of a potential suitor. The one really slow song is a gem: "Hometown" is a powerful tale of a woman who has decided to stay in her small hometown and marry because she's unable to leave. Acceptance of her fate comes eventually. The upward trajectory of this band continues with a European tour in the new year. Get on board now, go to www. bywater.ca.



Emily Burgess & the Emburys Never-Ending Fling Self

Emily Burgess rode her first album, Are We In Love?, to the New Artist MBA last year and was busily recording this one at the time of the awards. She describes Never-Ending Fling as 'catchy hooks, killer grooves, explosive 3-part harmony and there may be a few guitar solos in there too'. This new one should please the many fans of Are We In Love?. Marcus Browne on drums this time out along with those harmony vocals and Rico Browne is on bass and harmony vocals. Ryan Weber and Sam Weber are here again with Ryan writing or co-writing five songs. Jimmy Bowskill quests as well. The opener, "Black and Blue" has a great groove and a rather nice guitar solo from Emily. Both apply to "Gift of the Gab (I Need Your Love)" as well. Ryan Weber's baritone guitar underlies "Right Where We Belong", an original by Emily who again rips off a concise solo. A nicely stripped-down arrangement graces "I Won't Be Getting Played". The Webers wrote "Excuses" which rocks along very well indeed and has a radio friendly melody. Emily wrote the country-ish "My Heart's Lone Ranger" with Jimmy Bowskill questing on lap steel. The Webers also wrote "The Lion and the Lamb" but Emily generously hands the lead vocal to Marcus Browne. The CD Release Party was at the Dakota on November 10th and you should go to www.theemburys.com for more info. You will of course have caught Emily playing lead guitar at the Women's Blues Revue.

The Bluesland Horn Band Keep it in the Shadows Self


It was beginning to look like blues horn players were an endangered species but the number of albums with quest horn sections is increasing rapidly and we are now once

again seeing actual albums by working horn bands coming to the fore. The Bluesland Horn Band seems to have a pool of horn players at their disposal as three of the songs have a completely different horn section. They released their fifth in October and this Edmonton-based unit has a good one in Keep it in the Shadows. The songs are all originals. The lead vocalist is Marty Cochrane and Terry Medd holds down the guitar chair. The horn players for most of the songs: tenor, John Reid; trumpet, Doug Zacharias; baritone, Pat Belliveau, and tenor/alto Steve Williams. In the engine room, Pan Sciore on bass, Gavin Sorochan, drums and Guy Plecash, organ. The program gets under way with the rocking title tune, one by Terry Medd about how politicians like to "Keep it in the Shadows" to hide their misdeeds.



Great vocal from Cochrane and a superb piano contribution from Kenny "Blues Boss" Wayne, Zacharias and Medd get the solos. Some Western swing graces Medd's "New Suit", a humourous story about acquiring another one (from Elvis) after a motel fire burned his old one. Plecash wrote and sings "Stone Man Blues", a fine slow blues about lost love. He solos too on organ along with Medd. An attractive "Living on the Ceiling" channels Wolf's "Killing Floor" riff written by tenor man Reid. Sherman "Tank" Doucette guests on harp for a lament about aging, "Old Man Blues" written by Cochrane. There are a couple of instrumentals that harken back to 50's & 60's R&B bands and some jazzy pieces for a nicely varied program. The horn arrangements are top notch especially given that almost every song has a different arranger credit. Their web site is www.bluesland.ca.






