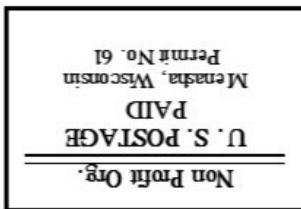

REFLECTIONS

In the Image and Likeness of God

I've had a few recent opportunities to share some of my iconography with St. Thomas. With those opportunities came questions about icons and the process of "writing" them. So, I'd like to share a few things about iconography - along with the promise of more to come.

The term ikon (icon in English) is simply the Greek word for an "image," sacred or otherwise. So, Christian iconography is a form of devotional art that's been an important expression of the Faith since the time of the Apostles. Iconography is rich with symbolism, often expressing ideas through allegory, highly stylized figures, and exaggerated poses. Unlike other artforms, Christian iconography is not a means of self-expression. Rather, the iconographer follows norms of iconographic expression, to "reproduce" these stylized images of our Lord and the Saints. As such, Christian iconography has much to say about its sacred subject matter, and little to say about the individual iconographer.

Icons transgress the boundaries of art, making them as much an expression of theology as any sermon or book. This is one reason icons are said to be "written," and not "painted." Likewise, icons are not "created" by the iconographer, for only God can create! Instead, an image is "translated" by the iconographer, with a fresh eye for expressing age-old truths about our Creator to those He created. Iconography owes this expression to the Incarnation of God, in the person of Jesus Christ. Because our Lord Jesus Christ is a good many things... including an icon (image) of the Eternal Father (John 14:9). Meaning, apart from God's Word becoming visible human flesh, we'd be unable to express that which is Divine in the form of any image.

If any of that leaves you wanting to know more about the ministry of iconography, then you'll want to mark a couple upcoming opportunities on your calendar. The first of these is **Sunday, April 12th**. This is the Second Sunday of Easter, often called "Doubting Thomas Sunday." Beginning this year at St. Thomas, we're going to claim that day as a Patronal Feast – a feast of our Patron Saint, Thomas the Apostle. And to celebrate our faithful patron, we'll have a single service at **9:00am** followed by a meal, fellowship, **a silent auction for an 8x10 icon of St. Thomas I'm currently writing**, and more. The proceeds from the icon auction will go to a ministry of St. Thomas, TBD. I pray you (YES, YOU) will plan to join us for that celebration – even if you've heard all you want to about icons. Secondly, at the request of several people, I'll offer a short presentation on iconography at the next **Senior Luncheon (4/14/26)**. Much of the Cruz Lillegard icon collection (including some I've written) will be there for you to see. So, I hope you'll attend that offering, as well.

Ministers Musings Hello friends . . . grace and peace,

A parishioner from St. Thomas called me a few weeks ago and asked if I would be willing to do a funeral. Specifically, the funeral for the stillborn child of their niece.

I of course said, “I’d be honored, yes.”

The visitation and funeral took place at a funeral home just outside the Fox Valley area. It was a small gathering of family and friends of the couple who unexpectedly lost their child. Their 2 other children were there as well and while they were young, they were old enough to know what was taking place.

Grief can be oh so very difficult and destructive.

We prayed together, we read the words of the 23rd Psalm, and attempted to find comfort and understanding in a situation that doesn’t offer much of either of those 2 things.

As Shannon and I have discovered in the wake of our son Mark’s death, there aren’t any words that can be spoken that help. Words are typically fleeting and most people – understandably – don’t know what to say to someone who has lost a child.

But as we ended the funeral for this little angel, and as we were saying good-byes and thank-yous to one another, I made sure I let the couple know that if they needed anything, feel free to call or text at any time.

They both said, “Thank you” and started to turn to walk away. But I stopped them. And I said to them, “I’m serious. You’re not alone in this. If you need to talk, to pray, to have me just listen, to cry together, whatever you need. I am here.”

They saw in my eyes I wasn’t kidding. And they knew, because I had obviously shared with them that I had also lost a child, that I understood, on a small level, the pain and grief they had.

A week later, I got a text from the mom, asking me to come and do a blessing and prayer in her new business she’s started. “I figured I should make sure that God presence is really in that space before anything else.”

Welcome to the ministry that comes from simply saying, “If you need something, I’m here for you.” It’s very simple. But it requires us to actually MEAN it. We can’t be everything or everywhere for everyone. But we CAN be there for some people some of the time for some of the things they need.

This is The Way of Jesus.

St Thomas Housing Committee -

The Fox Valley Faith Community Housing Summit was held in Appleton last October to address housing insecurity. About 150 faith communities in Appleton and Neenah/Menasha were invited, and 35 attended. The summit's mission is to build relationships between congregations and those facing housing insecurity, with a vision of showing God's love by working together for adequate, affordable housing. Five "Levers" (sub-groups) were formed to tackle different aspects of homelessness: Affordable Housing, Legislation, and Emergency Shelter are three of the key focus areas. In response, the St. Thomas Vestry created a Housing Committee to explore how our faith community can support this work. This committee grew out of the St. Thomas Evicted book study group and now meets regularly. **MOTHERS’ MERCY HOME
PARTNERSHIP —**

March Update

We recently received updates on the children who are partnered through our Mothers’ Mercy Home Partnership Program. Franka Doyen also provided the following information:

Our sponsorships cover a portion of the costs for school fees, school uniforms and learning materials. They continue until the child graduates from school at approximately 19 years of age, the age of majority. Franka Doyen, the sponsorship coordinator, regularly informs the Partner about their child’s progress. At the time of graduation from secondary school, due to a requirement of the Kenyan government, the child must leave MMH. Most are offered admission to the John Kaheni Residence. The school sponsorship automatically becomes a vocational training sponsorship or university studies sponsorship. *Of note: Among the children at MMH there are a few who, due to learning difficulties,*

are unable to attend secondary school after the 9th grade. Instead, they undertake vocational training at a boarding school. They remain under the care of the MMH social workers and under our sponsorship.

As every year, numerous activities were offered for the children during the long Christmas holidays – organized and supervised by the experienced trainers of the ChiCa (Children Care) team. The program began with active games such as rope skipping, speed stacking and rollerblading. This was followed by a diverse craft program that included knitting and crocheting as well as making bracelets from beads and buttons. In addition, various workshops were offered: Creative Writing, Exploring Our Planet Through Art, and one specifically for MMH school graduates entitled “My Future, My Path”. The woodworking shop was once again a popular spot where children built, repaired and worked creatively. Overall, the holidays offered a varied program that was enthusiastically received by the children.
