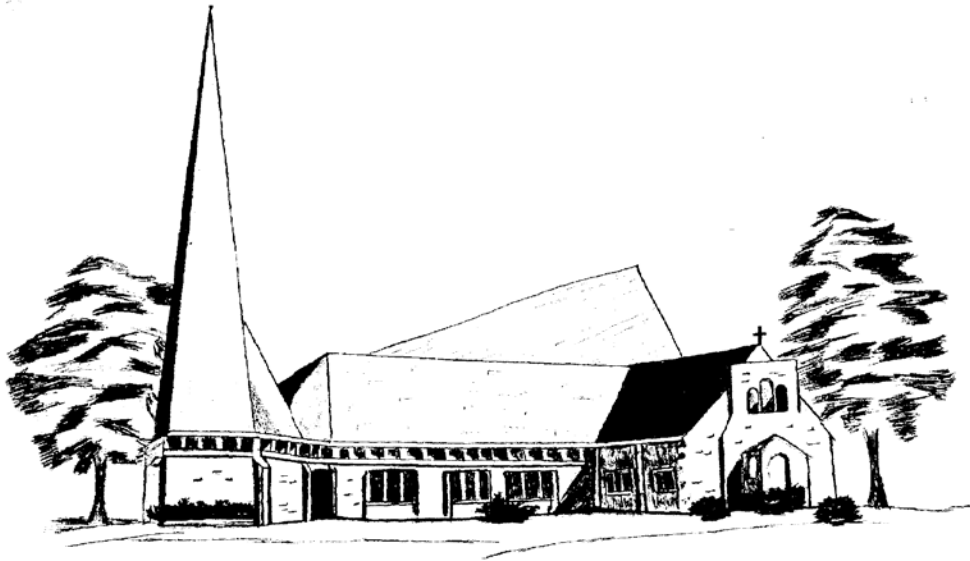

Concerning the Celebration

The rite presented here is of The Order of Holy Communion according to the practices of the Diocese of Masvingo, Anglican Church of Zimbabwe, Companion Diocese of the Diocese of Fond du Lac.

Approval for use on Companion Diocese Sunday, being the Seventh Sunday after Easter, has been made by the Bishop of the Diocese of Fond du Lac for the congregations of the diocese. When this liturgy is used in the local setting, it is expected the local customs will be followed, as much as possible, when the liturgy does not specify words or rubric.

The Masvingo liturgy is quite like the Episcopal Book of Common Prayer because both Churches are part of the Anglican Communion. The similarity comes from having the same roots as part of the Communion. Books of prayer of the various churches of the Anglican Communion have been altered, abridged, enlarged, and amended as seemed most convenient for the edification of the people, according to the various exigency of times and occasions. Even so, while there are different worship forms and usages, the substance of the Faith is kept. Those wanting to know more about this may refer to the Preface of the Book Common Prayer, page 9.

THE FIRST READING

Acts 1:6-14

When the apostles had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the

THE SECOND READING 1 Peter 4:12-14, 5:6-11

Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that is taking place among you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice insofar as you are sharing Christ's sufferings, so that you may also be glad and shout for joy when his glory is revealed. If you are reviled for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory, which is the Spirit of God, is resting on you. Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, so that he may exalt you in due time. Cast all your anxiety on him, because he cares for you. Discipline yourselves, keep alert. INVITATION TO VISUAL COMMUNION - In the medieval western church, a common practice was “ocular communion” or communing visually with Jesus in the Sacrament. This was done, for a variety of reasons, most of the congregation would reverence the Sacrament in place of physically receiving it. It is similar to what we do when we do Adoration and Benediction at the Eucharistic Festival or the Vigil before the Sacrament many of us keep Maundy Thursday. During this time of physical distancing when we are not able to gather in community to share in the Eucharist we invite you to visually contemplate and commune with Jesus in the Sacramental Bread. Here are a couple of prayers to assist you.

You can now give to St. Thomas online! During this time of physical distancing and sheltering in place, we are not gathering as a community during regular in-person Sunday services. Thus, there is not the usual Sunday offering that is a main source of income to St. Thomas.

For those of you who are able, we hope you will continue to give, either by mailing your donation to the church or by **giving online through the church website:** stthomaswi.com/give - Simply click on the gold 'Give Online' button on the Give page and fill out the pop-up form. The pop up form is actually on the Tithely website and is very secure, even though it looks like you are still on the St. Thomas website. Your gift can be a one time or recurring donation. You may give by using a credit card or your bank account. You can also cover the fees for your donation by clicking that box. Covering fees helps to reduce the cost to St. Thomas (a \$50 donation has a \$.81 fee) and the fee amount is a part of your tax-deductible donation. You can find step by step instructions on the church website under Important Information. We thank you for your faithfulness and generosity in supporting St. Thomas through this time.

We also know that for some of you, your income may have changed drastically. If you need help, please contact the church or Fr. Ralph. Double Portion is serving take-out meals on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays and the food pantry is open.

Faithful Innovation – A few members of St. Thomas as well as other Parishioners from our Diocese are participating in a process called Faithful Innovation. We will be meeting three times over the next few months to participate in a learning Community. (A learning community is a group of congregations who commit to one another in a nine month learning experience. Through prayer, skill-building, action and reflection they address pressing questions about the future.)

One of our first assignments is called “Dwelling in the Word.” Dwelling in the word is an ancient way of reading scripture. It’s a way of “spiritually submitting to the text” as one way God speaks to us.

Please join us in reading, and re-reading Acts 16:6-15: Which tells the story of the apostle Paul being redirected by the Holy Spirit to move from one direction of ministry to another; and with the added bonus of learning the results of that new ministry. 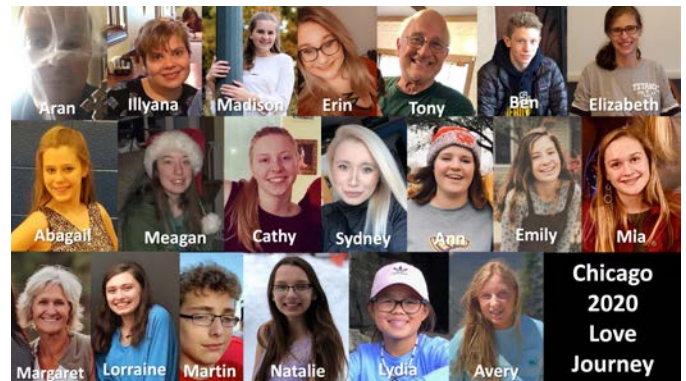
