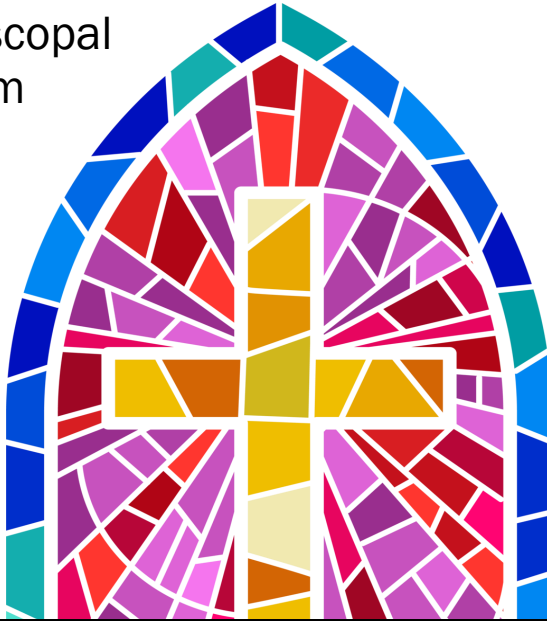

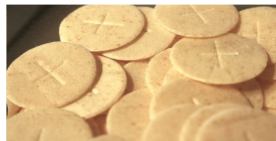

Keeping Watch with Jesus

“Then he said to them, ‘My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with me.’” -Matthew 26:38

The act of “keeping watch” with our Lord (in the form of His precious Body and Blood) is an ancient practice of the Church. A practice in which we’re afforded a participation with Christ’s Apostles, who are asked to keep watch with Him as He prays in the Garden of Gethsemane before his arrest and Passion. Following our Maundy Thursday service, the reserved Sacrament will be placed at the Altar of Repose in the Chapel, where you’ll have the opportunity to remain with Him and keep watch. This is a chance to further prepare our hearts for the agony of His Crucifixion and the celebration of His Resurrection.

A sign-up sheet for keeping watch will be in the parish hall. I encourage you to prayerfully consider filling one of the hour slots. If you feel more comfortable keeping watch with a loved one, by all means, ask them to keep watch with you. If you have no one else to ask, please ask me. Children's Sunday School



Children 3 years old through 6th grade. We meet Sunday mornings 9-9:50 in the downstairs classrooms from **September 22nd - May 11th**. We are continuing with the David C. Cook "Bible In Life" curriculum. Each week, across all age levels, Bible-in-Life students focus on these four areas: **1.** Connecting with each other and with God's Word, **2.** Studying God's Word together, **3.** Interacting with God's Word to find key themes and takeaways, **4.** Responding to God's Word by applying it to life. ****No Sunday school 4/20**** First Communion Classes will be offered on Sunday mornings during Lent.



St. Thomas Kid's Club

For children in **K- 6th grades**. We meet **Wednesday's 6:30-8pm** in the parish hall. **September 11th - May 14th.** ****No Kid's Club 3/5, 4/16**** We utilize the "Weaving God's Promises" curriculum. The "Mission" of Weaving God's Promises:

- To teach children and how God's promises of salvation are woven into our lives.
- Teach children the way of Christ, not only in the church but also in the world.
- Give children a solid grounding for future youth and high-school formation programs, which prepares them for Christian adulthood.
- To foster the spiritual formation and growth of our children in Christ's love and mercy and to teach the spirit of forgiveness and reconciliation.

Theological and Historical Information on our **Anglican/Episcopal** history and heritage is part of every session plan. Class sessions are structured around the Holy Eucharist as set forth in the Book of Common Prayer. **Gathering:** Simple activities focusing the children on the lesson to come. **Telling the Sacred Story** (Liturgy of the Word): Telling the biblical story. **Prayer** (Prayers of the People): Giving thanks to God for God's presence with us. **Sharing** (Holy Communion): Fellowship and snacks with time for sharing that week's story. **Sending Forth:** Closing prayer sends the children back to their homes. Wednesday nights are always spirit filled with running games, crafts, snacks, music, theme nights, prizes and most importantly - fun!

The Nursery is open!

Our nursery is available for the little ones during the 8 & 10am services, as well as during Sunday school time. It is staffed by Mrs. Wanda Weiland. Wanda does a wonderful job caring for our youngest parishioners. There is also a private space for nursing moms with a changing table, bouncer, portable crib and access to the live feed of the church service. **We gratefully accept gently used toys, board books and games for the nursery that are suitable for small children (no small pieces or parts please).**

Smile

The simplest act of smiling for as little as twenty seconds can trigger positive emotions, jump starting joy and happiness. Smiling stimulates the release of neuropeptides that work toward fighting off stress and unleashes a feel-good cocktail of the neurotransmitters serotonin, dopamine and endorphins. Serotonin acts as a natural antidepressant, dopamine stimulates the reward centers of the brain, and endorphins are natural painkillers. Smiling also seems to reward the brains of those who see us smiling making them feel better, too. Smiling is contagious stimulating unconscious smiling in others, which in turn spreads the positive effects.
