Fr. Bill blesses animals every year around October 4, the feast day of St. Francis, and many of us place his statue in our gardens to remind us that he loved all God's creatures, as should we.

But there is so much more to this beloved saint. Although St. Francis lived some 800 years ago, even today he inspires people of faith to follow in his path.

Did you know, for example, there are Episcopal Franciscans who live in the world—in their own homes and professions--as lay or clergy, married or single people in the Third Order Society of St. Francis (TSSF)? And that TSSF is an international religious order embraced by Anglicans worldwide? Members of the Third Order dedicate their lives to Christ and live by a Rule of Life patterned on the principles by which St. Francis lived.

If you want to go deeper in your life as a Christian, you owe it to yourself to learn more about the Third Order of St. Francis at tssf.org. Or speak to Amy Nicolson who is a member of the Order and would love to introduce you to what she has learned about

living a life dedicated to Christ in prayerfulness, study, simplicity, and care for creation—and doing so in St. Francis's singular spirit of love, joy, and humility.

Stewardship

Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

- I Peter 4:10

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Peter, the first leader of the post-Ascension church, offers a word of exhortation to his community that echoes across time and space. Use whatever gift you have received in service of others. In this way we are counted as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. Grace is gift and gift is grace, all from God and taking a variety of forms, and meant not just for ourselves but for the benefit of others. Stewards are not owners, but servants and managers of the property of another, and Peter tells us that proper management of God's property means that we deploy those graces for God's purpose which here is identified as serving others. It may have been harvest time and time for the first stewardship campaign of the early church.

For almost 2000 years, the faithful have been exhorted to share whatever gift they have received for the work of the church in serving others. Those others are fellow church members, those not yet in the church, and those who may not come to know the Lord in this lifetime. I am grateful that we have a highly faithful congregation. All in their own way, as circumstances some times dictate, are using the gifts entrusted to them by God for serving others. For some, it is their time that they generously give to the church. For others, a special gift of talent is used to bless the church's mission. And for others still, it is through generous financial gifts that they express their faithfulness. These forms of stewardship are, of course, not exclusive and those who are faithful stewards are typically generous with their time, talent, and treasure. Is there anything more Christlike than that? God, through Christ, gave his very best and gave his all to serve others.

Thank you for being Good Shepherds of the gifts you have received and for the gift of time, talent, and treasure you will pledge to the church for its mission in 2020. Please know that your generosity is being matched by the generosity of many, many others who make this a special place in



which to serve and to worship. You make St Peter smile. May you know his joy and the joy of our Lord who says to you, "Well done, good and faithful servant."

Corn Chowder Recipe

Earle Seaverns was a long time member of Good Shepherd. He contributed this lovely Corn Chowder recipe to the church published Cooking with Friends cookbook some years ago.

Corn Chowder

1/2 cup diced salt pork
1/2 cup chopped onions
2 diced potatoes
2 cans corn
2 Tbsp butter
2 cans evaporated milk
1 Tbsp parsley
1/4 tsp nutmeg

Fry salt pork gently until deep brown. Remove to paper towel. Saute onions in salt pork fat until clear. Put potatoes, onions, pork drippings and 2 cups boiling water in saucepan. Cover and cook until tender, not mushy (15 minutes). Add the corn. Season to taste and simmer 5 minutes. Add remaining ingredients. Heat. Add salt port bits and serve. Makes 7 to 8 cups. Can be frozen.
