It is a blessing to worship in person. Masks are welcome but not required. If you are experiencing symptoms of illness, please stay home and worship online. Please be respectful of those who continue to use masks and those who wish to limit physical contact (hugs/handshakes). We will continue to increase airflow in the sanctuary during worship to reduce risk. You may wish to sit near an open window for increased protection.

It is the **Second Sunday of Advent**, meaning "coming." In these weeks prior to Christmas we prepare for the celebration of God's coming into the world in baby Jesus. We ponder how God comes to us now and look forward to God's coming in the future. Advent is a season of hope! Today the prophet Isaiah shares a vision of peace, grounded in God.
