It is a blessing to worship in person. Masks are welcome and encouraged but not required. Please wear a mask if you are coughing or sneezing. If you are experiencing symptoms of illness, please stay home and worship online.

Today is the **Third Sunday in Lent**, a season of reflection and repentance as we walk with Jesus toward his suffering and death on the cross. In today's gospel, Jesus helps his followers—us—into a healthier perspective on God and suffering.

Today during 11 am worship we celebrate the **baptism** of Ada Detweiler! Blessings, child of God!

As we journey through Lent toward Easter, we're encouraged to practice three Lenten disciplines: fasting (giving up something that is distracting us from a deeper relationship with God), almsgiving (taking on acts of loving service that draw us closer to God), and prayer (connecting to the source of life).

Prayer ministers are available to pray one on one with individuals during Holy Communion and after worship.

Families with children: During 11 am worship, we offer a children's worship time in the basement classroom. We post Godly Play videos on our YouTube channel to use at home.
